In **Akkad** and **Sumer**, > 4,000 years ago, the months were called after the names of the signs of the Zodiac, the Sign of the 7th month (corresponding to "Libra"), was Tulku. The word 'Tul' means mound and the word 'ku' means sacred. Tulku means sacred mound; or, holy altar. The sign itself was called Bir, light.




In Arabic, "Libra" originally was **AI Zubena**, **purchase**, or **redemption**.

propitiation (from Lam, graciousness, and badia, branch).















Fig. 276. - Étoiles formant la figure du Scorpion.





The Sign of the Old Serpent, the Sign of the Great Red Dragon and its counterpart







Figure 2. Squier & Davis' (1848) plan view and cross section of Alligator Mound, This is the earliest documented rendering of the effigy.









Libra Scorpius Saggitarius Egyptian/Roman Mayan South





In all ancient Zodiacs it's a goat with a fish's tail, in Denderah and Esneh, Egypt, it's called *Hu-penius*, *the place of the sacrifice*. In the Indian Zodiac it is a goat *passant* traversed by a fish. The Goat is bowing its head as though falling down in death. The right leg is folded underneath the body, and he seems unable to rise with the left.

The tail of the fish, on the other hand, is full of vigor and life. Heb., *Gedi;* Ar. *Al Gedi, the kid* or *cut off*. Lat. *Capricorn, goat*. It has 51 stars: 3 of 3rd magnitude, 3 of the 4th, etc. 5 are remarkable: 3,  $\gamma$ ,  $\delta$  and  $\varepsilon$ , in the fishy tail. The star  $\alpha$ , in the horn, is named *Al Gedi, the kid* or *goat*,  $\beta$  is in the head,  $\delta$  is called *Deneb Al Gedi, the sacrifice to come*. Syr., *Dabih*, *the sacrifice slain; Al Dabik* and *Al Dehabeh* (Ar.) with same meaning; *Ma'asad, the slaying; Sa'ad al Naschira, the record of the cutting off*.

Results of *Google* Books for the ancient meaning of Capricorn as the suggestion of Büllinger makes little sense: How can Capricorn represent Jesus? **1**. A goat in a N.T. sense represents rebellion. **2**. It's a mythological hybrid with two natures. **3**. Jesus is represented by the Lamb or Ram (Aries), while Capricorn is giving its back to him, as opposed to Aries.

in the gospels. In *The Messiah before Jesus*: *The Suffering Servant of the Dead Sea Scrolls* (Berkeley: University of California Press, 2000), Israel Knohl shows how in two Dead Sea Scroll hymns the goat-horned beast was the emperor Augustus. He was the Capricorn (goat horn on his coin), "the false prophet" masquerading as Apollo, the "beast rising from the earth" with "two horns like a lamb" but "who spoke like a dragon" (Rev. 13.11). Augustus was the cruel beast who fooled worshipers and killed them.



the sidereal constellation (i.e. the actual stars) of Capricorn. In earlier times this constellation was known as the Gate of Death. Capricorn was also associated with an inverted pentagram; note the pentagram stands for the etheric body. Also Eliphas Levi connects the Goat (Capricorn) and the inverted pentagram with Baphomet!


Eastern Zodiacs show an urn alone.

Heb. *Deli* (Arabic *Delu*), *urn*, or *bucket*. The bright star in the urn has Egyptian name: *Mon* or *Meon*, *an urn*.

The Greeks ...invented stories, in one he is *Ganymede*, Jove's *cup-bearer*! Its modern name is Latin, *Aquarius*: *The pourer forth of water* [the liquid being swallowed by "*Pisces Austrinus*"]. The star  $\alpha$  (right shoulder) is *Sa'ad al Melik*, *The record of the pouring forth*. The star  $\beta$  (left shoulder) is *Saad al Sund*,

The star  $\delta$  (right leg, lower part), is known today as *Skat*, shin; in medieval times, it was in Heb. *Scheat*, *repeatedly*; Ar. "wish".
