“By Judean reckoning, **he was considered a year old on the day of his birth.**” (A Harmony..., 1984, Ch. 4, Chronology of the Ministry of Jesus Christ, p. 3).

The Eastern convention of counting a series of time included the current year, month, or day in the sum of the counting. Thus, a newborn baby was counted one year old from the day of birth. See Acts 10:30 for an example of this convention... In this record, a period of time that covered three days in Western counting was called by Cornelius "four days ago" in Eastern counting.

Time dealing with sacred matters was counted by years beginning with the month of Nisan. The years of the construction of the Temple are an example of a sacred matter. John 2:20 was spoken at Passover in Nisan of the forty-sixth year of the building of the Temple. The year 19 B.C. is determined from dates given by Josephus, a first-century Judean historian.

*(401) Accordingly, in the fifteenth year of his reign, Herod rebuilt the temple, and encompassed a piece of land about it with a wall; which land was twice as large as that before enclosed. **Josephus**, Wars, Book 1, Chapter 21.*

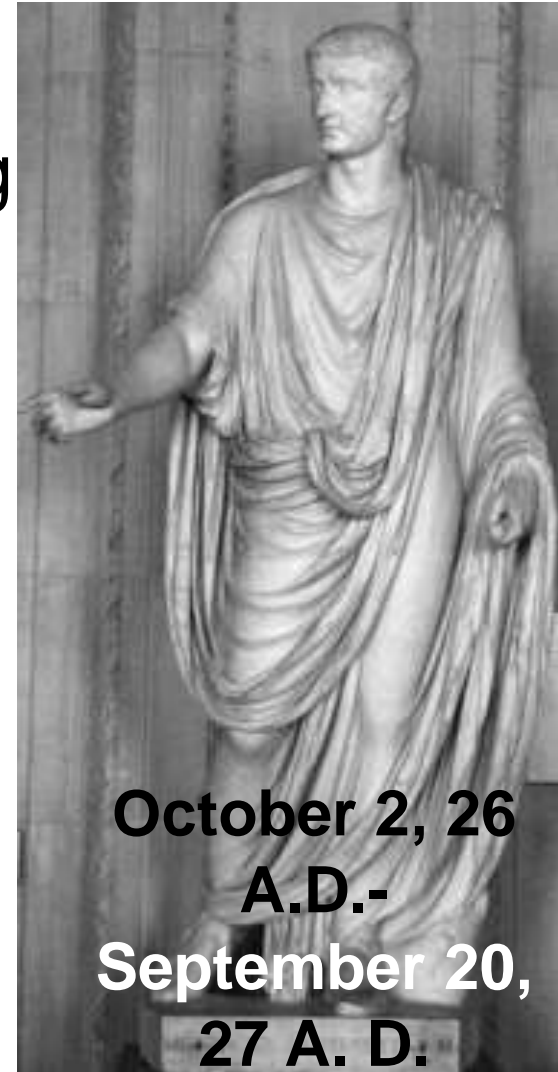

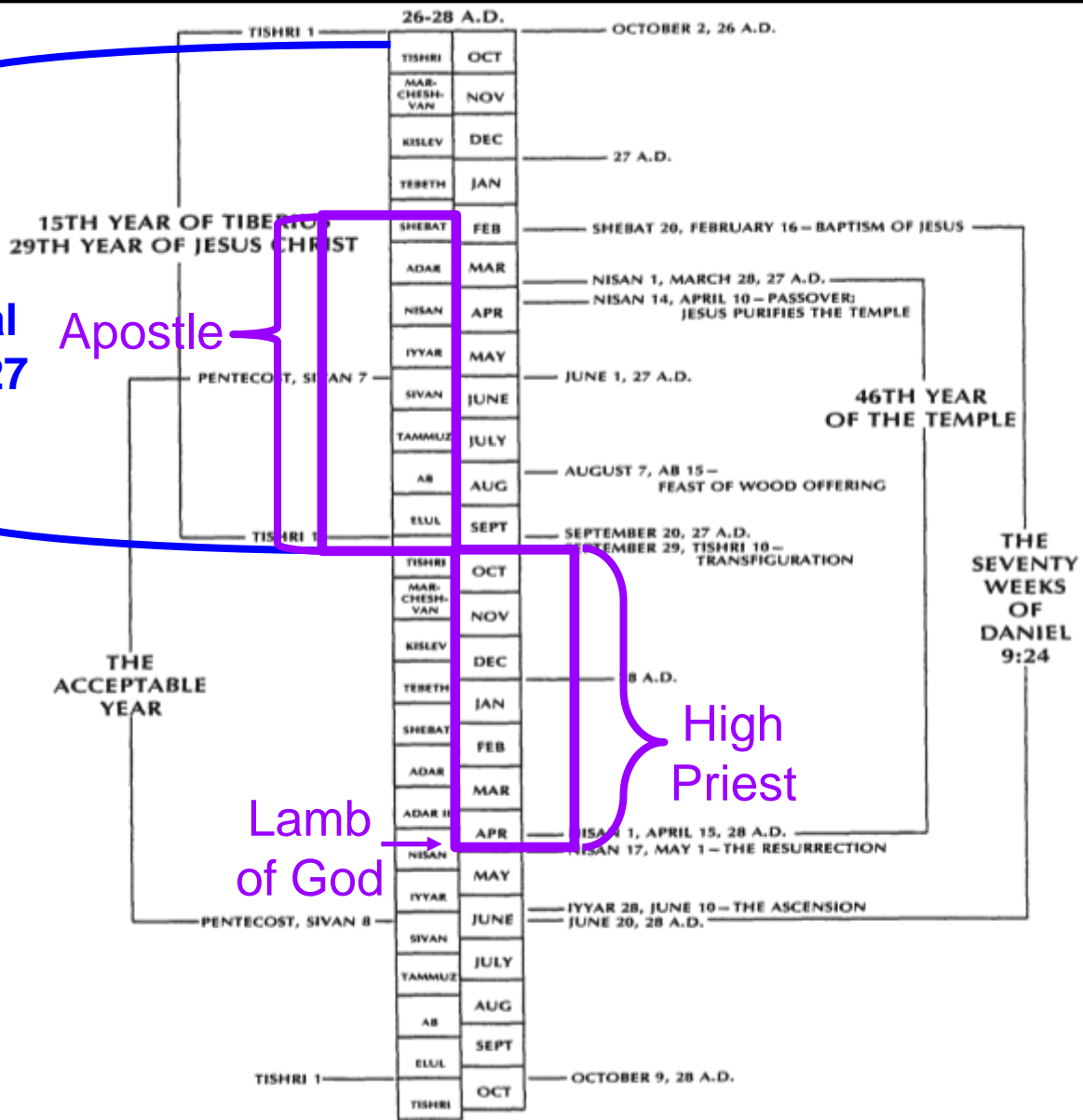

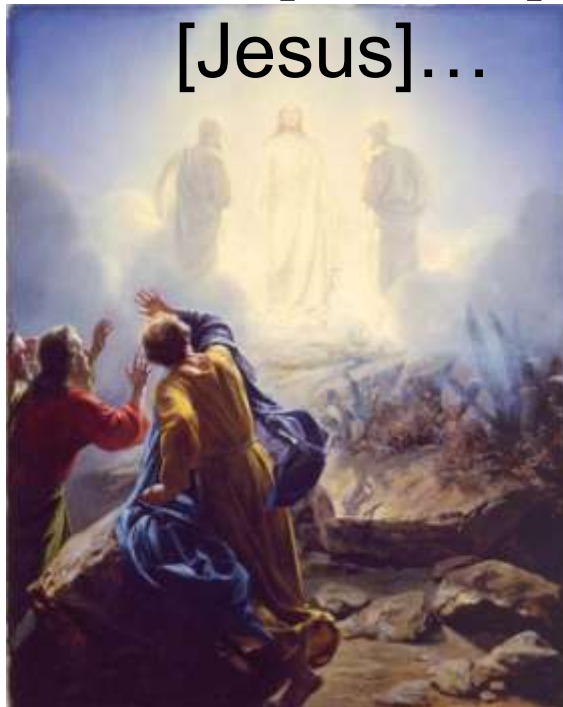
