
## HARMONY WITH NOTES OF THE FOUR GOSPELS (Version 1.1)

#### I. The Birth and Childhood of Jesus Christ

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

2. ROYAL GENEALOGY OF JESUS CHRIST. Matthew focuses on Jesus Christ as king, therefore this genealogy traces Mary's ancestry through King David back to Abraham. In Matthew 1:16 "husband" is an erroneous translation; this Joseph was the father of Mary. The text literally reads "man" or "mighty man," here meaning the head of a household. Furthermore, Matthew 1:17 states there were fourteen generations between the carrying away to Babylon and Christ. Without the generation indicated by

Joseph, the father of Mary, there would be only thirteen generations. Compare with #22 where Luke gives the legal genealogy of Joseph, the adoptive father of Jesus.

#### **MATTHEW 1:2-17**

1:2 Abraham begat Isaac; and Isaac begat Jacob; and Jacob begat Judas and his brethren; <sup>3</sup> And Judas begat Phares and Zara of Thamar; and Phares begat Esrom; and Esrom begat Aram; <sup>4</sup> And Aram begat Aminadab; and Aminadab begat Naasson; and Naasson begat Salmon; <sup>5</sup> And Salmon begat Booz of Rachab; and Booz begat Obed of Ruth; and Obed begat Jesse; <sup>6</sup> And Jesse begat David the king; and David the king begat Solomon of her that had been the wife of Urias; <sup>7</sup> And Solomon begat Roboam; and Roboam begat Abia; and Abia begat Asa; 8 And Asa begat Josaphat; and Josaphat begat Joram; and Joram begat Ozias; 9 And Ozias begat Joatham; and Joatham begat Achaz; and Achaz begat Ezekias; 10 And Ezekias begat Manasses; and Manasses begat Amon; and Amon begat Josias; 11 And Josias begat Jechonias and his brethren, about the time they were carried away to Babylon: <sup>12</sup> And after they were brought to Babylon, Jechonias begat Salathiel; and Salathiel begat Zorobabel; <sup>13</sup> And Zorobabel begat Abiud; and Abiud begat Eliakim; and Eliakim begat Azor; <sup>14</sup> And Azor begat Sadoc; and Sadoc begat Achim; and Achim begat Eliud; <sup>15</sup> And Eliud begat Eleazar; and Eleazar begat Matthan; and Matthan begat Jacob; <sup>16</sup> And Jacob begat Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom was born Jesus, who is called Christ. <sup>17</sup> So all the generations from Abraham to David are fourteen generations; and from David until the carrying away into Babylon are fourteen generations; and from the carrying away into Babylon unto Christ are fourteen generations.

#### 3. ANNOUNCEMENT TO ZACHARIAS OF JOHN THE BAPTIST--lyyar (May), 4 B.C.

## LUKE 1:5-22

1:5 There was in the days of Herod, the king of Judaea, a certain priest named Zacharias, of the course of Abia: and his wife was of the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elisabeth. <sup>6</sup> And they were both righteous before God, walking in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blameless. <sup>7</sup> And they had no child, because that Elisabeth was barren, and they both were now well stricken in years. 8 And it came to pass, that while he executed the priest's office before God in the order of his course, 9 According to the custom of the priest's office, his lot was to burn incense when he went into the temple of the Lord. 10 And the whole multitude of the people were praying without at the time of incense. 11 And there appeared unto him an angel of the Lord standing on the right side of the altar of incense. <sup>12</sup> And when Zacharias saw *him*, he was troubled, and fear fell upon him. <sup>13</sup> But the angel said unto him, Fear not, Zacharias: for thy prayer is heard; and thy wife Elisabeth shall bear thee a son, and thou shalt call his name John. 14 And thou shalt have joy and gladness; and many shall rejoice at his birth. <sup>15</sup> For he shall be great in the sight of the Lord, and shall drink neither wine nor strong drink; and he shall be filled with the Holy Ghost, even from his mother's womb. <sup>16</sup> And many of the children of Israel shall he turn to the Lord their God. <sup>17</sup> And he shall go before him in the spirit and power of Elias, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just; to make ready a people prepared for the Lord. <sup>18</sup> And Zacharias said unto the angel, Whereby shall I know this? for I am an old man, and my wife well stricken in years. <sup>19</sup> And the angel answering said unto him, I am Gabriel, that stand in the presence of God; and am sent to speak unto thee, and to shew thee these glad tidings. <sup>20</sup> And, behold, thou shalt be dumb, and not able to speak, until the day that these things shall be performed, because thou believest not my words, which shall be fulfilled in their season. <sup>21</sup> And the

people waited for Zacharias, and marvelled that he tarried so long in the temple. <sup>22</sup> And when he came out, he could not speak unto them: and they perceived that he had seen a vision in the temple: for he beckoned unto them, and remained speechless.

## 4. CONCEPTION OF JOHN THE BAPTIST--Sivan (June), 4 B.C.

## LUKE 1:23-25

1:23 And it came to pass, that, as soon as the days of his ministration were accomplished, he departed to his own house. <sup>24</sup> And after those days his wife Elisabeth conceived, and hid herself five months, saying, <sup>25</sup> Thus hath the Lord dealt with me in the days wherein he looked on *me*, to take away my reproach among men.

#### 5. ANNOUNCEMENT TO MARY OF JESUS CHRIST--Kislev (December), 4 B.C.

#### LUKE 1:26-38

1:26 And in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God unto a city of Galilee, named Nazareth, <sup>27</sup> To a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. <sup>28</sup> And the angel came in unto her, and said, Hail, thou that art highly favoured, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women. <sup>29</sup> And when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and cast in her mind what manner of salutation this should be. 30 And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God. <sup>31</sup> And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS. <sup>32</sup> He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David: 33 And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end. <sup>34</sup> Then said Mary unto the angel, How shall this be, seeing I know not a man? <sup>35</sup> And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God. <sup>36</sup> And, behold, thy cousin Elisabeth, she hath also conceived a son in her old age: and this is the sixth month with her, who was called barren. <sup>37</sup> For with God nothing shall be impossible. <sup>38</sup> And Mary said, Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word. And the angel departed from her.

#### 6. MARY'S VISIT TO ELISABETH--three months

## LUKE 1:39-56

1:39 And Mary arose in those days, and went into the hill country with haste, into a city of Juda; <sup>40</sup> And entered into the house of Zacharias, and saluted Elisabeth. <sup>41</sup> And it came to pass, that, when Elisabeth heard the salutation of Mary, the babe leaped in her womb; and Elisabeth was filled with the Holy Ghost: <sup>42</sup> And she spake out with a loud voice, and said, Blessed *art* thou among women, and blessed *is* the fruit of thy womb. <sup>43</sup> And whence *is* this to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? <sup>44</sup> For, lo, as soon as the voice of thy salutation sounded in mine ears, the babe leaped in my womb for joy. <sup>45</sup> And blessed *is* she that believed: for there shall be a performance of those things which were told her from the Lord. <sup>46</sup> And Mary said, My soul doth magnify the Lord, <sup>47</sup> And my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour. <sup>48</sup> For he hath regarded the low estate of his handmaiden: for, behold, from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed. <sup>49</sup> For he that is mighty hath

done to me great things; and holy *is* his name. <sup>50</sup> And his mercy *is* on them that fear him from generation to generation. <sup>51</sup> He hath shewed strength with his arm; he hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. <sup>52</sup> He hath put down the mighty from *their* seats, and exalted them of low degree. <sup>53</sup> He hath filled the hungry with good things; and the rich he hath sent empty away. <sup>54</sup> He hath holpen his servant Israel, in remembrance of *his* mercy; <sup>55</sup> As he spake to our fathers, to Abraham, and to his seed for ever. <sup>56</sup> And Mary abode with her about three months, and returned to her own house.

#### 7. BIRTH OF JOHN THE BAPTIST--Adar (March), 3 B.C.

## LUKE 1:57-80

1:57 Now Elisabeth's full time came that she should be delivered; and she brought forth a son. <sup>58</sup> And her neighbours and her cousins heard how the Lord had shewed great mercy upon her; and they rejoiced with her. <sup>59</sup> And it came to pass, that on the eighth day they came to circumcise the child; and they called him Zacharias, after the name of his father. <sup>60</sup> And his mother answered and said, Not so; but he shall be called John. <sup>61</sup> And they said unto her, There is none of thy kindred that is called by this name. <sup>62</sup> And they made signs to his father, how he would have him called. <sup>63</sup> And he asked for a writing table, and wrote, saying, His name is John. And they marvelled all. <sup>64</sup> And his mouth was opened immediately, and his tongue *loosed*, and he spake, and praised God. <sup>65</sup> And fear came on all that dwelt round about them: and all these sayings were noised abroad throughout all the hill country of Judaea. 66 And all they that heard them laid them up in their hearts, saying, What manner of child shall this be! And the hand of the Lord was with him. 67 And his father Zacharias was filled with the Holy Ghost, and prophesied, saying, <sup>68</sup> Blessed be the Lord God of Israel; for he hath visited and redeemed his people, <sup>69</sup> And hath raised up an horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David; <sup>70</sup> As he spake by the mouth of his holy prophets, which have been since the world began: <sup>71</sup> That we should be saved from our enemies, and from the hand of all that hate us; <sup>72</sup> To perform the mercy promised to our fathers, and to remember his holy covenant; <sup>73</sup> The oath which he sware to our father Abraham, <sup>74</sup> That he would grant unto us, that we being delivered out of the hand of our enemies might serve him without fear, <sup>75</sup> In holiness and righteousness before him, all the days of our life. <sup>76</sup> And thou, child, shalt be called the prophet of the Highest: for thou shalt go before the face of the Lord to prepare his ways; <sup>77</sup> To give knowledge of salvation unto his people by the remission of their sins, <sup>78</sup> Through the tender mercy of our God; whereby the dayspring from on high hath visited us, <sup>79</sup> To give light to them that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace. 80 And the child grew, and waxed strong in spirit, and was in the deserts till the day of his shewing unto Israel.

#### 8. JOSEPH AND MARY COME TOGETHER

#### MATTHEW 1:18-24

1:18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was on this wise: When as his mother Mary was espoused to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Ghost. <sup>19</sup> Then Joseph her husband, being a just *man*, and not willing to make her a publick example, was minded to put her away privily. <sup>20</sup> But while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the

Holy Ghost. <sup>21</sup> And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins. <sup>22</sup> Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, <sup>23</sup> Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us. <sup>24</sup> Then Joseph being raised from sleep did as the angel of the Lord had bidden him, and took unto him his wife

#### 11. PRESENTATION OF JESUS TO THE LORD AT THE TEMPLE--Marcheshvan 11 (October 22), 3 B.C.

## LUKE 2:22-24

2:22 And when the days of her purification according to the law of Moses were accomplished, they brought him to Jerusalem, to present *him* to the Lord; <sup>23</sup> (As it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that openeth the womb shall be called holy to the Lord;) <sup>24</sup> And to offer a sacrifice according to that which is said in the law of the Lord, A pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons.

#### 12. PROPHECY OF SIMEON AND ANNA IN THE TEMPLE--Marcheshvan 11 (October 22), 3 B.C.

[Editor's Note: The evidence of oriental customs indicates that Joseph and Mary were in the middle of their honey moon when they went to Bethlehem and then to Jerusalem; so, after being at the Temple in Jerusalem fulfilling the law, it makes sense that they returned to Nazareth (Lk. 2:39) with their relatives to complete their honey moon before going back to Bethlehem to their meeting with the Magoi]

#### LUKE 2:25-38; LUKE 2:39

2:25 And, behold, there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon; and the same man was just and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel: and the Holy Ghost was upon him. <sup>26</sup> And it was revealed unto him by the Holy Ghost, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Lord's Christ. <sup>27</sup> And he came by the Spirit into the temple: and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him after the custom of the law, <sup>28</sup> Then took he him up in his arms, and blessed God, and said, <sup>29</sup> Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word: 30 For mine eyes have seen thy salvation, 31 Which thou hast prepared before the face of all people; <sup>32</sup> A light to lighten the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel. <sup>33</sup> And Joseph and his mother marvelled at those things which were spoken of him. <sup>34</sup> And Simeon blessed them, and said unto Mary his mother, Behold, this *child* is set for the fall and rising again of many in Israel; and for a sign which shall be spoken against; <sup>35</sup> (Yea, a sword shall pierce through thy own soul also,) that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed. <sup>36</sup> And there was one Anna, a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Aser: she was of a great age, and had lived with an husband seven years from her virginity; <sup>37</sup> And she was a widow of about fourscore and four years, which departed not from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers night and day. 38 And she coming in that instant gave thanks likewise unto the Lord, and spake of him to all them that looked for redemption in Jerusalem. <sup>39</sup> And when they had performed all things according to the law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, to their own city Nazareth.

#### **MATTHEW 2:1-12**

2:1 Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, <sup>2</sup> Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him. <sup>3</sup> When Herod the king had heard these things, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. <sup>4</sup> And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born. <sup>5</sup> And they said unto him, In Bethlehem of Judaea: for thus it is written by the prophet, <sup>6</sup> And thou Bethlehem, in the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall rule my people Israel. <sup>7</sup> Then Herod, when he had privily called the wise men, enquired of them diligently what time the star appeared. <sup>8</sup> And he sent them to Bethlehem, and said, Go and search diligently for the young child; and when ye have found him, bring me word again, that I may come and worship him also. 9 When they had heard the king, they departed; and, lo, the star, which they saw in the east, went before them, till it came and stood over where the young child was. 10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy. 11 And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him: and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense, and myrrh. <sup>12</sup> And being warned of God in a dream that they should not return to Herod, they departed into their own country another way.

#### 14. JOSEPH, MARY, AND JESUS FLEE TO EGYPT

#### MATTHEW 2:13-15

2:13 And when they were departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeareth to Joseph in a dream, saying, Arise, and take the young child and his mother, and flee into Egypt, and be thou there until I bring thee word: for Herod will seek the young child to destroy him. <sup>14</sup> When he arose, he took the young child and his mother by night, and departed into Egypt: <sup>15</sup> And was there until the death of Herod: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, Out of Egypt have I called my son.

## 15. SLAUGHTER OF BETHLEHEM CHILDREN

#### MATTHEW 2:16-18

2:16 Then Herod, when he saw that he was mocked of the wise men, was exceeding wroth, and sent forth, and slew all the children that were in Bethlehem, and in all the coasts thereof, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had diligently enquired of the wise men. <sup>17</sup> Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying, <sup>18</sup> In Rama was there a voice heard, lamentation, and weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping *for* her children, and would not be comforted, because they are not.

## MATTHEW 2:19-23

2:19 But when Herod was dead, behold, an angel of the Lord appeareth in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, <sup>20</sup> Saying, Arise, and take the young child and his mother, and go into the land of Israel: for they are dead which sought the young child's life. <sup>21</sup> And he arose, and took the young child and his mother, and came into the land of Israel. <sup>22</sup> But when he heard that Archelaus did reign in Judaea in the room of his father Herod, he was afraid to go thither: notwithstanding, being warned of God in a dream, he turned aside into the parts of Galilee: <sup>23</sup> And he came and dwelt in a city called Nazareth: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, He shall be called a Nazarene.

#### 17. JESUS' CHILDHOOD TO AGE TWELVE

21. THE OFFICIAL OPENING OF JESUS' MINISTRY AS THE APOSTLE; JOHN BAPTIZES JESUS -Shebat 20 (February 16), 27 A.D. With the Law Administration concluding, God now brings in the Christ Administration by His voice from heaven and by Jesus' receiving the spirit. Matthew 3: 17 records the voice from heaven saying, "This is my beloved Son" whereas Mark and Luke record "Thou art [You are] my beloved Son." Some Greek manuscripts have "You are" rather than "This is" in Matthew, also. "You are my beloved Son" is the correct translation in that Jesus Christ is the only one recorded as hearing the voice. This is the first announcement from heaven. The second announcement occurs on the mount of transfiguration (event #96) and the third, which selected the Passover lamb, in the Jerusalem area (event #127). There is no record of any persons being present at Jesus' baptism besides John. At Jesus' baptism the voice is directed to Jesus, whereas at the transfiguration the message is directed to the witnesses present (see event #96). John 1:34 (event #25) indicates John bore witness that Jesus Christ was the Son of God. The baptism officially begins Jesus' ministry as the Apostle (Acts 1:22; Hebrews 3:1). John's ministry has concluded, and Jesus' has begun!

22. LEGAL GENEALOGY OF JESUS CHRIST. This genealogy traces the ancestry of Mary's husband, Joseph, whom people supposed was Jesus' father, back to Adam. This genealogy is recorded here because Luke focuses on Jesus Christ as a man. Compare with event #2.

23. TEMPTATIONS IN THE WILDERNESS--forty days - Matthew, Mark, and Luke all record that after his baptism Jesus goes into the wilderness where he is tempted for forty days. Afterwards, the Devil himself comes to Jesus and tempts him with the four basic things that motivate man: self-preservation, love (or worship), recognition, and greed. Matthew and Luke both mention the temptation of turning stones into bread. Food is essential for self-preservation and would have been a genuine temptation after forty days of fasting. Only Luke mentions the second temptation in which the Devil shows Jesus all the kingdoms of the world and offers their glory to him. In Greek the word "world" is oikoumene, meaning "the inhabited world." The essence of the second temptation is that the Devil offers Jesus all the worship and love of the people on earth. Both Matthew and Luke mention the third temptation. If Jesus Christ had jumped off the pinnacle of the Temple and lived, he would have received great recognition and notoriety among the people. The fourth temptation is only in Matthew. Due to its similarity to the second temptation mentioned in Luke, Matthew 4: 8 starts with the word "again." In Matthew 4: 8 and 9 the Devil again shows Jesus Christ the kingdoms of the world. However, in Matthew the word "world" is the Greek word kosmos, the entire world. These differing details establish that the Devil's displays of the world in

Matthew and Luke are indeed two different temptations. Thus the fourth and last temptation (recorded in Matthew) is greed. The Aramaic text shows a similar distinction in the words for "world."

24. JOHN BAPTIZES BEYOND JORDAN--Adar 30 (March 27), 27 A.D. This event occurs while Jesus is returning from the wilderness. The exact location of this event is uncertain. John 1: 28 in some texts reads "Bethany," in others reads "Bethabara," and in others reads "Betharaba." The location of these sites beyond the Jordan in Perea is unknown.

#### JOHN 1:19-28

1:19 And this is the record of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, Who art thou? <sup>20</sup> And he confessed, and denied not; but confessed, I am not the Christ. <sup>21</sup> And they asked him, What then? Art thou Elias? And he saith, I am not. Art thou that prophet? And he answered, No. <sup>22</sup> Then said they unto him, Who art thou? that we may give an answer to them that sent us. What sayest thou of thyself? <sup>23</sup> He said, I *am* the voice of one crying in the wilderness, Make straight the way of the Lord, as said the prophet Esaias. <sup>24</sup> And they which were sent were of the Pharisees. <sup>25</sup> And they asked him, and said unto him, Why baptizest thou then, if thou be not that Christ, nor Elias, neither that prophet? <sup>26</sup> John answered them, saying, I baptize with water: but there standeth one among you, whom ye know not; <sup>27</sup> He it is, who coming after me is preferred before me, whose shoe's latchet I am not worthy to unloose. <sup>28</sup> These things were done in Bethabara beyond Jordan, where John was baptizing.

25. JOHN SEES JESUS--next day; Nisan 1 (March 28), 27 A.D. In John 1:32 John the Baptist speaks of the baptism of Jesus in the past tense. The Gospel of John does not give the actual incident of Jesus being baptized; it only refers to the baptism as having taken place.

#### JOHN 1:29-34

1:29 The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world. <sup>30</sup> This is he of whom I said, After me cometh a man which is preferred before me: for he was before me. <sup>31</sup> And I knew him not: but that he should be made manifest to Israel, therefore am I come baptizing with water. <sup>32</sup> And John bare record, saying, I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it abode upon him. <sup>33</sup> And I knew him not: but he that sent me to baptize with water, the same said unto me, Upon whom thou shalt see the Spirit descending, and remaining on him, the same is he which baptizeth with the Holy Ghost. <sup>34</sup> And I saw, and bare record that this is the Son of God.

26. JESUS MEETS ANDREW AND PETER--next day; Nisan 2 (March 29), 27 A.D. [Note of the Editor: The other disciple with Andrew in verse 37 may as well have been John himself!]

#### JOHN 1:35-42

1:35 Again the next day after John stood, and two of his disciples; <sup>36</sup> And looking upon Jesus as he walked, he saith, Behold the Lamb of God! <sup>37</sup> And the two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus. <sup>38</sup> Then Jesus turned, and saw them following, and saith unto them, What seek ye? They said unto him, Rabbi, (which is to say, being interpreted, Master,) where dwellest thou? <sup>39</sup> He saith unto them, Come and see. They came and saw where he dwelt, and abode with him that day: for it was about the tenth hour. <sup>40</sup> One of the two which heard John *speak*, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. <sup>41</sup> He first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, We have found the Messias, which is, being interpreted, the Christ. <sup>42</sup> And he brought him to Jesus. And when Jesus beheld him, he said, Thou art Simon the son of Jona: thou shalt be called Cephas, which is by interpretation, A stone.

#### 27. JESUS MEETS PHILIP AND NATHANAEL [Bartholomew]--next day; Nisan 3 (March 30), 27 A.D.

#### JOHN 1:43-51

1:43 The day following Jesus would go forth into Galilee, and findeth Philip, and saith unto him, Follow me. <sup>44</sup> Now Philip was of Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. <sup>45</sup> Philip findeth Nathanael, and saith unto him, We have found him, of whom Moses in the law, and the prophets, did write, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph. <sup>46</sup> And Nathanael said unto him, Can there any good thing come out of Nazareth? Philip saith unto him, Come and see. <sup>47</sup> Jesus saw Nathanael coming to him, and saith of him, Behold an Israelite indeed, in whom is no guile! <sup>48</sup> Nathanael saith unto him, Whence knowest thou me? ## 28. JESUS' FIRST MIRACLE AT WEDDING IN CANA--three days later; Nisan 6 (April 2), 27 A.D.

## JOHN 2:1-11

2:1 And the third day there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee; and the mother of Jesus was there: <sup>2</sup> And both Jesus was called, and his disciples, to the marriage. <sup>3</sup> And when they wanted wine, the mother of Jesus saith unto him, They have no wine. <sup>4</sup> Jesus saith unto her, Woman, what have I to do with thee? mine hour is not yet come. <sup>5</sup> His mother saith unto the servants, Whatsoever he saith unto you, do *it*. <sup>6</sup> And there were set there six waterpots of stone, after the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three firkins apiece. <sup>7</sup> Jesus saith unto them, Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. <sup>8</sup> And he saith unto them, Draw out now, and bear unto the governor of the feast. And they bare *it*. <sup>9</sup> When the ruler of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and knew not whence it was: (but the servants which drew the water knew;) the governor of the feast called the bridegroom, <sup>10</sup> And saith unto him, Every man at the beginning doth set forth good wine; and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: *but* thou hast kept the good wine until now. <sup>11</sup> This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee, and manifested forth his glory; and his disciples believed on him.

#### 29. TO CAPERNAUM FOR A FEW DAYS--Nisan 7 (April 3), 27 A.D.

#### JOHN 2:12

2:12 After this he went down to Capernaum, he, and his mother, and his brethren, and his disciples: and they continued there not many days.

#### III. Passover (April 10) to Pentecost (June 1) in 27 A.D.

30. JESUS TO JERUSALEM FOR PASSOVER; CLEANSES THE TEMPLE; TALKS WITH NICODEMUS--Nisan 10-21 (April 6-17), 27 A.D.

#### JOHN 2:13-3:21

2:13 And the Jews' passover was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem, <sup>14</sup> And found in the temple those that sold oxen and sheep and doves, and the changers of money sitting: 15 And when he had made a scourge of small cords, he drove them all out of the temple, and the sheep, and the oxen; and poured out the changers' money, and overthrew the tables: 16 And said unto them that sold doves, Take these things hence; make not my Father's house an house of merchandise. 17 And his disciples remembered that it was written, The zeal of thine house hath eaten me up. 18 Then answered the Jews and said unto him, What sign shewest thou unto us, seeing that thou doest these things? 19 Jesus answered and said unto them, Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up. <sup>20</sup> Then said the Jews, Forty and six years was this temple in building, and wilt thou rear it up in three days? <sup>21</sup> But he spake of the temple of his body. <sup>22</sup> When therefore he was risen from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this unto them; and they believed the scripture, and the word which Jesus had said. <sup>23</sup> Now when he was in Jerusalem at the passover, in the feast day, many believed in his name, when they saw the miracles which he did. 24 But Jesus did not commit himself unto them, because he knew all men, <sup>25</sup> And needed not that any should testify of man: for he knew what was in man.

3:1 There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews: <sup>2</sup> The same came to Jesus by night, and said unto him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him.<sup>3</sup> Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. <sup>4</sup> Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born? <sup>5</sup> Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. <sup>6</sup> That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. 7 Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again. 8 The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit. 9 Nicodemus answered and said unto him, How can these things be? 10 Jesus answered and said unto him, Art thou a master of Israel, and knowest not these things? 11 Verily, verily, I say unto thee, We speak that we do know, and testify that we have seen; and ye receive not our witness. <sup>12</sup> If I have told you earthly things, and ye believe not, how shall ye believe, if I tell you of heavenly things? 13 And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but he that came down from heaven, even the Son of man which is in heaven. 14 And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: 15 That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life. 16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him

should not perish, but have everlasting life. <sup>17</sup> For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. <sup>18</sup> He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. <sup>19</sup> And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. <sup>20</sup> For every one that doeth evil hateth the light, neither cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reproved. <sup>21</sup> But he that doeth truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God.

## 31. JESUS GOES TO COUNTRYSIDE OF JUDEA AND HIS DISCIPLES BAPTIZE; JOHN BEARS RECORD OF JESUS

#### JOHN 3:22-36

3:22 After these things came Jesus and his disciples into the land of Judaea; and there he tarried with them, and baptized. <sup>23</sup> And John also was baptizing in Aenon near to Salim, because there was much water there: and they came, and were baptized. <sup>24</sup> For John was not yet cast into prison. <sup>25</sup> Then there arose a question between *some* of John's disciples and the Jews about purifying. <sup>26</sup> And they came unto John, and said unto him, Rabbi, he that was with thee beyond Jordan, to whom thou barest witness, behold, the same baptizeth, and all men come to him. <sup>27</sup> John answered and said, A man can receive nothing, except it be given him from heaven. <sup>28</sup> Ye yourselves bear me witness, that I said, I am not the Christ, but that I am sent before him. <sup>29</sup> He that hath the bride is the bridegroom: but the friend of the bridegroom, which standeth and heareth him, rejoiceth greatly because of the bridegroom's voice: this my joy therefore is fulfilled. <sup>30</sup> He must increase, but I must decrease. <sup>31</sup> He that cometh from above is above all: he that is of the earth is earthly, and speaketh of the earth: he that cometh from heaven is above all. <sup>32</sup> And what he hath seen and heard, that he testifieth; and no man receiveth his testimony. <sup>33</sup> He that hath received his testimony hath set to his seal that God is true. 34 For he whom God hath sent speaketh the words of God: for God giveth not the Spirit by measure unto him. <sup>35</sup> The Father loveth the Son, and hath given all things into his hand. <sup>36</sup> He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him.

32. JESUS LEAVES JUDEA AND GOES TO SYCHAR FOR TWO DAYS; MEETS WOMAN AT THE WELL. John 4:1-3 should not be confused with Matthew 4:12; Mark 1:14a; and Luke 4:14a (event #36). Event #36 records a different trip to Galilee, upon Jesus' hearing of John's arrest, not "when therefore the Lord knew how the Pharisees had heard that Jesus made and baptized more disciples than John," as in John 4: 1. Also, John 4:54 (event #33) records a miracle which is "the second miracle that Jesus did, when he was come out of Judaea into Galilee." Event #33 is also earlier in Jesus' ministry than the record of his departure to Galilee (event #36) after which he performs numerous miracles in Galilee. John 3:24 (event #31) also says that John is not yet in prison.

When referring to the four months until harvest in John 4:35, Jesus says that his disciples should not say that they must plant and then wait for harvest because the "fields" of which he is speaking are "white already to harvest." Here, "white" refers to the white color of clothes of the approaching people which was analogous to the white sheen of certain crops when ripe. [Editor's Note: A careful study indicates that both John the Baptist and Jesus the Christ started their ministries within a Sabbatical year! Jesus aptly said that four months remained for the end of that Sabbatical year that went from Tishri 10 (Oct. 11, 26 A.D.) to Tishri 10 (Sept. 29, 27 A.D.) For the classic Sabbatical calendar see: Benedict Zuckermann "Über Sabbathjahrcyclus und Jubelperiode," Breslau, 1859 (translated into English by A. Loewy, London, 1866.)]

#### JOHN 4:1-42

4:1 When therefore the Lord knew how the Pharisees had heard that Jesus made and baptized more disciples than John, <sup>2</sup> (Though Jesus himself baptized not, but his disciples,) <sup>3</sup> He left Judaea, and departed again into Galilee. <sup>4</sup> And he must needs go through Samaria. <sup>5</sup> Then cometh he to a city of Samaria, which is called Sychar, near to the parcel of ground that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. <sup>6</sup> Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied with his journey, sat thus on the well: and it was about the sixth hour. <sup>7</sup> There cometh a woman of Samaria to draw water: Jesus saith unto her, Give me to drink. 8 (For his disciples were gone away unto the city to buy meat.) <sup>9</sup> Then saith the woman of Samaria unto him, How is it that thou, being a Jew, askest drink of me, which am a woman of Samaria? for the Jews have no dealings with the Samaritans. 10 Jesus answered and said unto her, If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and he would have given thee living water. 11 The woman saith unto him, Sir, thou hast nothing to draw with, and the well is deep: from whence then hast thou that living water? <sup>12</sup> Art thou greater than our father Jacob, which gave us the well, and drank thereof himself, and his children, and his cattle? <sup>13</sup> Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: <sup>14</sup> But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life. <sup>15</sup> The woman saith unto him, Sir, give me this water, that I thirst not, neither come hither to draw. <sup>16</sup> Jesus saith unto her, Go, call thy husband, and come hither. <sup>17</sup> The woman answered and said, I have no husband. Jesus said unto her, Thou hast well said, I have no husband: <sup>18</sup> For thou hast had five husbands; and he whom thou now hast is not thy husband: in that saidst thou truly. <sup>19</sup> The woman saith unto him, Sir, I perceive that thou art a prophet. <sup>20</sup> Our fathers worshipped in this mountain; and ye say, that in Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship. <sup>21</sup> Jesus saith unto her, Woman, believe me, the hour cometh, when ye shall neither in this mountain, nor yet at Jerusalem, worship the Father. <sup>22</sup> Ye worship ye know not what: we know what we worship: for salvation is of the Jews. <sup>23</sup> But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him. <sup>24</sup> God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth. <sup>25</sup> The woman saith unto him, I know that Messias cometh, which is called Christ: when he is come, he will tell us all things. <sup>26</sup> Jesus saith unto her, I that speak unto thee am he. <sup>27</sup> And upon this came his disciples, and marvelled that he talked with the woman: yet no man said, What seekest thou? or, Why talkest thou with her? <sup>28</sup> The woman then left her waterpot, and went her way into the city, and saith to the men, <sup>29</sup> Come, see a man, which told me all things that ever I did: is not this the Christ? <sup>30</sup> Then they went out of the city, and came unto him. <sup>31</sup> In the mean while his disciples prayed him, saying, Master, eat. 32 But he said unto them, I have meat to eat that ye know not of. <sup>33</sup> Therefore said the disciples one to another, Hath any man brought him ought to eat? 34 Jesus saith unto them, My meat is to do the will of him that sent me, and to finish his work. <sup>35</sup> Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest. <sup>36</sup> And he that reapeth receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto life eternal: that both he that soweth and he that reapeth may rejoice together. <sup>37</sup> And herein is that saying true, One soweth, and another reapeth. <sup>38</sup> I sent you to reap that whereon ye bestowed no labour: other men laboured, and ye are entered into their labours. <sup>39</sup> And many of the Samaritans of that city believed on him for the saying of the woman, which testified, He told me all that ever I did. <sup>40</sup> So when the Samaritans were come unto him, they be sought him that he would tarry with them: and he abode there two days. 41 And many more believed because of his own word; <sup>42</sup> And said unto the woman, Now we believe, not because of thy saying: for we have heard *him* ourselves, and know that this is indeed the Christ, the Saviour of the world.

# 33. JESUS RETURNS TO CANA OF GALILEE AFTER TWO DAYS; JESUS' SECOND MIRACLE, IN GALILEE

## JOHN 4:43-54

4:43 Now after two days he departed thence, and went into Galilee. 44 For Jesus himself testified, that a prophet hath no honour in his own country. <sup>45</sup> Then when he was come into Galilee, the Galilaeans received him, having seen all the things that he did at Jerusalem at the feast: for they also went unto the feast. 46 So Jesus came again into Cana of Galilee, where he made the water wine. And there was a certain nobleman, whose son was sick at Capernaum. 47 When he heard that Jesus was come out of Judaea into Galilee, he went unto him, and besought him that he would come down, and heal his son: for he was at the point of death. 48 Then said Jesus unto him, Except ye see signs and wonders, ye will not believe. 49 The nobleman saith unto him, Sir, come down ere my child die. 50 Jesus saith unto him, Go thy way; thy son liveth. And the man believed the word that Jesus had spoken unto him, and he went his way. 51 And as he was now going down, his servants met him, and told him, saying, Thy son liveth. 52 Then enquired he of them the hour when he began to amend. And they said unto him, Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him. 53 So the father knew that it was at the same hour, in the which Jesus said unto him, Thy son liveth: and himself believed, and his whole house. 54 This is again the second miracle that Jesus did, when he was come out of Judaea into Galilee.

34. JOHN THE BAPTIST DELIVERED TO PRISON. Luke 3:19 and 20 belongs here in chronological sequence. John's imprisonment is recorded in a summary in Luke 3:19 and 20 using a figure of speech, parembole. In English usage this can be noted by a parenthesis. This parembole is inserted to mark the close of John's ministry. John could not have been imprisoned at this time, for the verses following in Luke tell us that John baptized Jesus. This is indicated by the first part of Luke 3:21, "Now when all the people were baptized." Literally at this point in the chronology

John had not finished baptizing. Event #24 also indicates he continued to baptize. This parembole (Luke 3:19, 20) refers instead to the spiritual conclusion of John's ministry as the last prophet in the Law Administration. The information in this parembole is brought into this record in Luke (events #79 and #80) from its chronological sequence to add emphasis to this change of administration and the official spiritual opening of Jesus' ministry as the Apostle to Israel.

## (LUKE 3:19-20)

3:19 But Herod the tetrarch, being reproved by him for Herodias his brother Philip's wife, and for all the evils which Herod had done, <sup>20</sup> Added yet this above all, that he shut up John in prison.

35. JESUS GOES TO JERUSALEM FOR PENTECOST--Sivan 7 (June 1), 27 A.D. In these verses Jesus returns from Galilee to Jerusalem for Pentecost. The use of the past tense in John 5: 35 regarding John the Baptist, "He was a burning and a shining light," indicates that John is imprisoned at this point. According to Josephus, John was imprisoned at Herod's fortress of Machaerus in Perea. This event begins with the record of the healing of the man at the pool of Bethesda. In some texts a forgery has been inserted which is in the King James Version. It is found in the last part of John 5:3 ("waiting for the moving of the water") and continues through the end of verse 4. Many of the oldest manuscripts do not have this section. The Sabbath mentioned in this record is the High Sabbath, Pentecost (Sunday).

#### JOHN 5:1-47

5:1 After this there was a feast of the Jews; and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. <sup>2</sup> Now there is at Jerusalem by the sheep *market* a pool, which is called in the Hebrew tongue Bethesda, having five porches. 3 In these lay a great multitude of impotent folk, of blind, halt, withered, waiting for the moving of the water. <sup>4</sup> For an angel went down at a certain season into the pool, and troubled the water: whosoever then first after the troubling of the water stepped in was made whole of whatsoever disease he had. <sup>5</sup> And a certain man was there, which had an infirmity thirty and eight years. <sup>6</sup> When Jesus saw him lie, and knew that he had been now a long time in that case, he saith unto him, Wilt thou be made whole? <sup>7</sup> The impotent man answered him, Sir, I have no man, when the water is troubled, to put me into the pool: but while I am coming, another steppeth down before me. 8 Jesus saith unto him, Rise, take up thy bed, and walk. 9 And immediately the man was made whole, and took up his bed, and walked: and on the same day was the sabbath. <sup>10</sup> The Jews therefore said unto him that was cured, It is the sabbath day: it is not lawful for thee to carry thy bed. 11 He answered them, He that made me whole, the same said unto me, Take up thy bed, and walk. 12 Then asked they him, What man is that which said unto thee, Take up thy bed, and walk? <sup>13</sup> And he that was healed wist not who it was: for Jesus had conveyed himself away, a multitude being in that place. 14 Afterward Jesus findeth him in the temple, and said unto him, Behold, thou art made whole: sin no more, lest a worse thing come unto thee. <sup>15</sup> The man departed, and told the Jews that it was Jesus, which had made him whole. 16 And therefore did the Jews persecute Jesus, and sought to slay him, because he had done these things on the sabbath day. 17 But Jesus answered them, My Father worketh hitherto, and I work. <sup>18</sup> Therefore the Jews sought the more to kill him, because he not only had broken the sabbath, but said also that God was his Father, making himself equal with God. <sup>19</sup> Then answered Jesus and said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he seeth the Father do: for what things soever he doeth, these also doeth the Son likewise. <sup>20</sup> For the Father loveth the Son, and sheweth him all things that

himself doeth: and he will shew him greater works than these, that ye may marvel. <sup>21</sup> For as the Father raiseth up the dead, and quickeneth them; even so the Son quickeneth whom he will. <sup>22</sup> For the Father judgeth no man, but hath committed all judgment unto the Son: <sup>23</sup> That all *men* should honour the Son, even as they honour the Father. He that honoureth not the Son honoureth not the Father which hath sent him. <sup>24</sup> Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life. <sup>25</sup> Verily, verily, I say unto you, The hour is coming, and now is, when the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God: and they that hear shall live. <sup>26</sup> For as the Father hath life in himself; so hath he given to the Son to have life in himself; <sup>27</sup> And hath given him authority to execute judgment also, because he is the Son of man. 28 Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear his voice, <sup>29</sup> And shall come forth; they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; and they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation. <sup>30</sup> I can of mine own self do nothing: as I hear, I judge: and my judgment is just; because I seek not mine own will, but the will of the Father which hath sent me. 31 If I bear witness of myself, my witness is not true. <sup>32</sup> There is another that beareth witness of me; and I know that the witness which he witnesseth of me is true. 33 Ye sent unto John, and he bare witness unto the truth. 34 But I receive not testimony from man: but these things I say, that ye might be saved. <sup>35</sup> He was a burning and a shining light: and ye were willing for a season to rejoice in his light. <sup>36</sup> But I have greater witness than that of John: for the works which the Father hath given me to finish, the same works that I do, bear witness of me, that the Father hath sent me. <sup>37</sup> And the Father himself, which hath sent me, hath borne witness of me. Ye have neither heard his voice at any time, nor seen his shape. <sup>38</sup> And ye have not his word abiding in you: for whom he hath sent, him ye believe not. <sup>39</sup> Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me. 40 And ye will not come to me, that ye might have life. 41 I receive not honour from men. 42 But I know you, that ye have not the love of God in you. 43 I am come in my Father's name, and ye receive me not: if another shall come in his own name, him ye will receive. 44 How can ye believe, which receive honour one of another, and seek not the honour that cometh from God only? 45 Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father: there is one that accuseth you, even Moses, in whom ye trust. 46 For had ye believed Moses, ye would have believed me: for he wrote of me. 47 But if ye believe not his

## writings, how shall ye believe my words?

36. JESUS HEARS THAT JOHN THE BAPTIST IS IN PRISON; RETURNS TO GALILEE—immediately after Pentecost. These records regarding Jesus' return to Galilee when he heard of John's arrest belong immediately after Jesus' Jerusalem stay recorded in John 5:1-47 (event #35). Compare with events #32 and #33.

#### IV. The Summer of 27 A.D. (June 1 – September 19)

37. THE PRACTICAL (PUBLIC) OPENING OF JESUS' MINISTRY AS THE APOSTLE, IN NAZARETH ON THE SABBATH--Sivan 13 (June 7), 27 A.D. The function of an apostle is to bring new light to his generation. The "new light" that Jesus brought to his generation on that Sabbath in Nazareth was the relevance of Isaiah 61 to his own ministry, which included preaching the acceptable year of the Lord.

#### LUKE 4:16-30

4:16 And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up: and, as his custom was, he went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read. <sup>17</sup> And there was delivered unto him the book of the prophet Esaias. And when he had opened the book, he found the place where it was written, 18 The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised, <sup>19</sup> To preach the acceptable year of the Lord. <sup>20</sup> And he closed the book, and he gave it again to the minister, and sat down. And the eyes of all them that were in the synagogue were fastened on him. <sup>21</sup> And he began to say unto them, This day is this scripture fulfilled in your ears. <sup>22</sup> And all bare him witness, and wondered at the gracious words which proceeded out of his mouth. And they said, Is not this Joseph's son? <sup>23</sup> And he said unto them, Ye will surely say unto me this proverb, Physician, heal thyself: whatsoever we have heard done in Capernaum, do also here in thy country. <sup>24</sup> And he said, Verily I say unto you, No prophet is accepted in his own country. <sup>25</sup> But I tell you of a truth, many widows were in Israel in the days of Elias, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, when great famine was throughout all the land; <sup>26</sup> But unto none of them was Elias sent, save unto Sarepta, a city of Sidon, unto a woman that was a widow. 27 And many lepers were in Israel in the time of Eliseus the prophet; and none of them was cleansed, saving Naaman the Syrian. 28 And all they in the synagogue, when they heard these things, were filled with wrath, <sup>29</sup> And rose up, and thrust him out of the city, and led him unto the brow of the hill whereon their city was built, that they might cast him down headlong. <sup>30</sup> But he passing through the midst of them went his way.

38. DEPARTURE FOR CAPERNAUM; PROCLAMATION OF THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN BEGINS IN CAPERNAUM. According to Matthew 4:17, from this time Jesus begins to preach the Kingdom of Heaven. Further, the prophecy recorded in Isaiah 9:1 and 2 was fulfilled in that the people in Galilee "saw great light" because "light is sprung up" (Matthew 4:16). Jesus Christ as the Apostle to Israel brought new light to his generation. See event #37.

#### 39. CALLING OF FOUR DISCIPLES BY THE SEA OF GALILEE

#### MATTHEW 4:18-22

4:18 And Jesus, walking by the sea of Galilee, saw two brethren, Simon called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea: for they were fishers. <sup>19</sup> And he saith unto them, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. <sup>20</sup> And they straightway left *their* nets, and followed him. <sup>21</sup> And going on from thence, he saw other two brethren, James *the son* of Zebedee, and John his brother, in a ship with Zebedee their father, mending their nets; and he called them. <sup>22</sup> And they immediately left the ship and their father, and followed him.

## MARK 1:16-20

1:16 Now as he walked by the sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew his brother casting a net into the sea: for they were fishers. <sup>17</sup> And Jesus said unto them, Come ye after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men. <sup>18</sup> And straightway they forsook their nets, and followed him. <sup>19</sup> And when he had gone a little farther thence, he saw James the *son* of Zebedee, and John his brother, who also were in the ship mending their nets. <sup>20</sup> And straightway he called them: and they left their father Zebedee in the ship with the hired servants, and went after him.

#### 40. TRAVEL THROUGH GALILEE; SUMMARY STATEMENT

## MATTHEW 4:23-25

4:23 And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all manner of sickness and all manner of disease among the people. <sup>24</sup> And his fame went throughout all Syria: and they brought unto him all sick people that were taken with divers diseases and torments, and those which were possessed with devils, and those which were lunatick, and those that had the palsy; and he healed them. <sup>25</sup> And there followed him great multitudes of people from Galilee, and *from* Decapolis, and *from* Jerusalem, and *from* Judaea, and *from* beyond Jordan.

41. TEACHING ON A MOUNTAIN IN GALILEE. The records of this event and of event #58 are often mistakenly treated as one. But this record takes place on "a mountain" (Matthew 5:1) while the record in Luke takes place "in the plain" (Luke 6:17). In Matthew, after the teaching on a mountain, Jesus goes to Capernaum, where a centurion meets him and asks him to heal his child. In Luke, after teaching on the plain, Jesus enters Capernaum and a centurion sends "elders of the Jews" concerning his servant. The entire sequence of events in the two Gospels shows they are different teachings.

#### MATTHEW 5:1-7:29

kingdom of heaven. 11 Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. 12 Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you. 13 Ye are the salt of the earth: but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be salted? it is thenceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out, and to be trodden under foot of men. 14 Ye are the light of the world. cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell. 31 It hath been said, Whosoever shall put away his wife, let him give her a writing of divorcement: <sup>32</sup> But I say unto you, That whosoever shall put away his wife, saving for the cause of fornication, causeth her to commit adultery: and whosoever shall marry her that is divorced committeth adultery. 33 Again, ye have heard that it hath been said by them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord thine oaths: <sup>34</sup> But I say unto you, Swear not at all; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne: 35 Nor by the earth; for it is his footstool: neither by Jerusalem; for it is the city of the great King. <sup>36</sup> Neither shalt thou swear by thy head, because thou canst not make one hair white or black. <sup>37</sup> But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil. 38 Ye have heard that it hath been said, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth: <sup>39</sup> But I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also. 40 And if any man will sue thee at the law, and take away thy coat, let him have thy cloke also. 41 And whosoever shall compel thee to go a mile, go with him twain. 42 Give to him that asketh thee, and from him that would borrow of thee turn not thou away. 43 Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy. 44 But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you; <sup>45</sup> That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust. 46 For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye? do not even the publicans the same? 47 And if ve salute your brethren only, what do ye more than others? do not even the publicans so? 48 Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.

6:1 Take heed that ye do not your alms before men, to be seen of them: otherwise ye have no reward of your Father which is in heaven. <sup>2</sup> Therefore when thou doest *thine* alms, do not sound a trumpet before thee, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may have glory of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. <sup>3</sup> But when thou doest alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth: <sup>4</sup> That thine alms may be in secret: and thy Father which seeth in secret himself shall reward thee openly. <sup>5</sup> And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the hypocrites *are*: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of

men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. <sup>6</sup> But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly. <sup>7</sup> But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking. <sup>8</sup> Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him. 9 After this manner therefore pray ye: Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. <sup>10</sup> Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven. 11 Give us this day our daily bread. 12 And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. 13 And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen. <sup>14</sup> For if ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you: 15 But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. <sup>16</sup> Moreover when ye fast, be not, as the hypocrites, of a sad countenance: for they disfigure their faces, that they may appear unto men to fast. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. <sup>17</sup> But thou, when thou fastest, anoint thine head, and wash thy face; <sup>18</sup> That thou appear not unto men to fast, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father, which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly. <sup>19</sup> Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: <sup>20</sup> But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: <sup>21</sup> For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also. <sup>22</sup> The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine eye be single, thy whole body shall be full of light. <sup>23</sup> But if thine eye be evil, thy whole body shall be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great is that darkness! <sup>24</sup> No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon. <sup>25</sup> Therefore I say unto you, Take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. Is not the life more than meat, and the body than raiment? <sup>26</sup> Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they? <sup>27</sup> Which of you by taking thought can add one cubit unto his stature? <sup>28</sup> And why take ye thought for raiment? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they spin: <sup>29</sup> And yet I say unto you, That even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of

these. <sup>30</sup> Wherefore, if God so clothe the grass of the field, which to day is, and to morrow is cast into the oven, *shall he* not much more *clothe* you, O ye of little faith? <sup>31</sup> Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? <sup>32</sup> (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. <sup>33</sup> But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. <sup>34</sup> Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day *is* the evil thereof.

7:1 Judge not, that ye be not judged. <sup>2</sup> For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again. 3 And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye? 4 Or how wilt thou say to thy brother, Let me pull out the mote out of thine eye; and, behold, a beam is in thine own eye? <sup>5</sup> Thou hypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eye. <sup>6</sup> Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend you. <sup>7</sup> Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you: 8 For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened. 9 Or what man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he give him a stone? 10 Or if he ask a fish, will he give him a serpent? 11 If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him? <sup>12</sup> Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets. <sup>13</sup> Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: <sup>14</sup> Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it. 15 Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. <sup>16</sup> Ye shall know them by their fruits. authority, and not as the scribes.

42. HEALING OF A LEPER. This healing is not identical with the healing of the leper in event # 50. First of all, this healing of the leper in Matthew 8:1-4 directly follows the teaching on the mountain (event #41). Secondly, events #42 and #50 cannot be identical, because if they were then the sequence of events #43-48 would be broken. This is impossible since event #45 is identical in Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Furthermore, following this healing of a leper, Jesus enters Capernaum; whereas after the healing of the leper in event #50, Jesus leaves "a certain city" and withdraws himself into desert places. See event #50.

#### **MATTHEW 8:1-4**

8:1 When he was come down from the mountain, great multitudes followed him. <sup>2</sup> And, behold, there came a leper and worshipped him, saying, Lord, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean. <sup>3</sup> And Jesus put forth *his* hand, and touched him, saying, I will; be thou clean. And immediately his leprosy was cleansed. <sup>4</sup> And Jesus saith unto him, See thou tell no man; but go thy way, shew thyself to the priest, and offer the gift that Moses commanded, for a testimony unto them.

43. HEALING· OF A CENTURION' S SERVANT (CHILD) IN CAPERNAUM. The word translated "servant" in Matthew 8:6 means "child" in both Aramaic and Greek. This event differs from event #59 where a centurion's servant is healed. The centurion here comes to Jesus, while in event #59 he sends messengers to Jesus.

8:5 And when Jesus was entered into Capernaum, there came unto him a centurion, beseeching him, <sup>6</sup> And saying, Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, grievously tormented. <sup>7</sup> And Jesus saith unto him, I will come and heal him. <sup>8</sup> The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed. <sup>9</sup> For I am a man under authority, having soldiers under me: and I say to this *man*, Go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant, Do this, and he doeth *it*. <sup>10</sup> When Jesus heard *it*, he marvelled, and said to them that followed, Verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel. <sup>11</sup> And I say unto you, That many shall come from the east and west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of heaven. <sup>12</sup> But the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. <sup>13</sup> And Jesus said unto the centurion, Go thy way; and as thou hast believed, so be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour.

44. HEALING OF A POSSESSED MAN IN CAPERNAUM SYNAGOGUE ON THE SABBATH. In the King James Version, Mark 1:21 states, "on the sabbath day," singular, while Luke 4:31 states, "on the sabbath days," plural. The word "sabbath" is plural in Greek and Aramaic in both Mark and Luke. Normally, the plural usage of this word in the Biblical languages indicates the singular, "sabbath." For this reason, many versions correctly translate this by the singular, "sabbath."

49. TEACHING IN A BOAT; MIRACLE OF DRAUGHT OF FISHES. This is the only record in which the Sea of Galilee is called "the lake of Gennesaret," because the city of Gennesaret was nearby. Compare with event #84 (Matthew 14:34; Mark 6:53).

#### LUKE 5:1-11

5:1 And it came to pass, that, as the people pressed upon him to hear the word of God, he stood by the lake of Gennesaret, <sup>2</sup> And saw two ships standing by the lake: but the fishermen were gone out of them, and were washing their nets. <sup>3</sup> And he entered into one of the ships, which was Simon's, and prayed him that he would thrust out a little from the land. And he sat down, and taught the people out of the ship. 4 Now when he had left speaking, he said unto Simon, Launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught. <sup>5</sup> And Simon answering said unto him, Master, we have toiled all the night, and have taken nothing: nevertheless at thy word I will let down the net. <sup>6</sup> And when they had this done, they inclosed a great multitude of fishes: and their net brake. <sup>7</sup> And they beckoned unto their partners, which were in the other ship, that they should come and help them. 50. HEALING OF A LEPER; JESUS WITHDRAWS HIMSELF INTO "DESERT PLACES." Jesus has to be "without in desert places" because this leper disobeys Jesus' command by openly talking about the healing. As the news spreads, large crowds gather. Therefore, Jesus could not go directly into Capernaum. Compare with event #42 (Matthew 8:1-4).

54. PICKING OF GRAIN ON THE SABBATH. Chronologically the events in Matthew 12 and 13 are interspersed with events in Matthew 8:18--11:30. In Luke 6:1, "second sabbath after the first" is translated from one Greek word, <u>deuteroproto</u>. The word occurs only here in all of Greek literature, and no ancient commentator has ever given a satisfactory explanation of its meaning. In view of this, the word is most certainly a spurious addition. The text should simply read, "and it came to pass on a sabbath," which is the reading in some manuscripts.

55. HEALING OF A MAN WITH A WITHERED HAND--on another Sabbath. In Mark and Luke the record of the man with the withered hand follows the incident of picking grain on another Sabbath by at least a week, as indicated by the words "again" (Mark 3:1) and "on another sabbath" (Luke 6:6). Therefore, the Matthew 12:9 record which states, "and when he was departed thence, he went into their synagogue," cannot indicate that Jesus departed and immediately went into the synagogue.

58. TEACHING ON A PLAIN. This event differs from the teaching on a mountain in Galilee in event #41 ("a mountain", Matthew 5:1), although the contents of the two teachings are similar. Compare event #41.

61. JOHN THE BAPTIST SENDS MESSENGERS TO JESUS. Matthew 11:2-30 belongs here in chronological sequence. In Matthew, this incident of the two messengers coming from John the Baptist is a parembole. The purpose of this parembole is to illustrate the type of response that the "workmen" (the apostles who are called out in Matthew 10) would eventually receive. Both John the Baptist and the twelve apostles are eventually rejected by a generation that will not hear (Matthew 11:16-24). Luke gives the visit of John's messengers in its chronological position. Furthermore, the messengers are not sent because of John's doubting Jesus Christ's ministry. The visit is for the profit of John's followers who could see for themselves that everything John prophesied about Jesus is true and that they should not despair because of their leader's imprisonment.

64. TEACHINGS OF PARABLES TO PHARISEES AND MULTITUDES; KINSMEN ARRIVE TO SEIZE JESUS. The first recorded event of this day is Jesus teaching the parable of the sower to the people (Luke 8:4-8). Jesus is sitting in the open courtyard of a home, speaking to the multitudes. While he is there, a blind and dumb man who is possessed is brought to him, and Jesus heals him. Pharisees and scribes are sitting close by, and their reaction to this miracle is to say that Jesus has Beelzebub. As Jesus is speaking, his mother and brothers come to the outside of the crowd, intending to seize him. Unable to approach him because of the crowd, they call for him to come out. Jesus refuses. Later, Jesus gives the parable of the sower a second time (Matthew 13:1-9; Mark 4:1-9). This time he is at the Sea of Galilee, teaching from a boat to the crowds on the shore.

66. Jesus returns to a house with his disciples, where they question him concerning the meaning of the parables and why he used them to teach the people. So within this event, Matthew 13:10-23; Mark 4:10-25; and Luke 8:9-18 are all <u>paremboles</u>, nonchronological parentheses, which give the explanation of the parable of the sower. The explanation is recorded immediately after the parable itself, even though it does not take place until after the crowds are dismissed and Jesus is alone with his disciples. Compare with events #112 and #114.

79. HEROD HEARS OF JESUS AFTER JOHN'S DEATH. Matthew 14:1 begins with the phrase, "at that time," which literally means, "in that season." This is still the summer season in which Jesus is proclaiming the Kingdom of Heaven. Around the same time of the year, after Jesus preaches the kingdom, performs many miracles, and ordains and commissions his twelve apostles (who escalate the impact of God's Word), Herod is trapped into beheading John the Baptist by Herodias and Salome, her daughter.

82. DEPARTURE TO A SOLITARY PLACE NEAR BETHSAIDA; FIRST MIRACLE OF LOAVES AND FISHES, ABOUT 5,000 MEN FED--Ab 15 (August 7), 27 A.D. This event is one of the few Gospel accounts which is recorded in all four Gospels. It is a noteworthy miracle since Jesus feeds about 5,000 men with five loaves and two fish. Each of the four Gospel accounts of the feeding of the 5,000 is similar. Additional information is supplied by the Gospel of John which records that Jesus questioned Philip to prove him and gives the response of the crowd at the close of the miracle. Matthew adds that those fed included not only 5,000 men but also women and children. In Biblical culture, the count normally included only the men, so there were many more than 5,000 people present.

This event of feeding about 5,000 men occurs when "a feast of the Jews, was nigh" (John 6:4). Not all texts add the words "the Passover" to John 6:4; these words are an obvious insertion into the text. Jesus Christ fulfilled the whole law. Therefore, he would have gone to Jerusalem if it were Passover, but there is nothing about a trip to Jerusalem anywhere in the context of this event. Also, the Church Father Origen omits the word "Passover" when he alludes to this verse. The feast in John 6:4 is specifically called "a feast of the Jews." This was the popular Judean feast of non-Biblical origin called the Feast of the Wood Offering. At this feast each year, people brought wood into the Temple at Jerusalem.

This event is similar to, but not identical with, a later miracle recorded in event #91 (Matthew 15:32-39a; Mark 8:1-9) in which Jesus feeds about 4,000 men with seven loaves and a few small fish. Typically, as in most accounts of this nature with similar accounts recorded in the Gospels, the vast majority of Bible commentators assume the accounts are identical and handle them as one event. This type of error

has led to much confusion in Gospel harmony studies. Jesus mentions both miracles as separate events in event #92 (Matthew 16:9-10; Mark 8:19-20). This is another example of two seemingly identical

events which upon closer observation prove not to be identical at all.

83. DISCIPLES ROW BACK ACROSS THE SEA OF GALILEE; JESUS WALKS ON WATER. Event # 82 occurs near the city of Bethsaida on the east coast of the Sea of Galilee. But Mark 6:45 indicates they took a boat across the lake to Bethsaida. In Aramaic "Bethsaida" means "house" or "place of fishing." Thus the "Bethsaida" referred to in Mark 6:45 is a fishing area near the city of Gennesaret on the west coast of the Sea of Galilee, not the city of Bethsaida on the east coast.

88. DEPARTURE TO BORDER OF TIRE AND SIDON. In event #87 Jesus is at Capernaum. In events #88 and #89, Jesus travels to "the borders of Tyre and Sidon" (Mark 7:24a). Jesus never entered Tyre or Sidon. Many people have assumed that Jesus went right to the cities of Tyre and Sidon on this trip. This idea comes from Mark 7:31. Some Greek manuscripts of that verse read, "And again, going forth out of the district of Tyre, he came through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee." However, many Greek and Aramaic manuscripts read the way the King James Version does. In event #89 Jesus says he is not sent but to the lost sheep of the house of Israel (Matthew 15:24). Also the woman that comes to Jesus in event #89 is specifically said to be "of Canaan" (Matthew 15:22), "a Syrophenician by nation" (Mark 7:26). Since everyone who lived outside of Israel in the area of Tyre and Sidon was a Syrophenician by nation, one of the reasons for pointing out the woman's nationality would be to show that she came into Galilee to find Jesus. Furthermore, Jesus is never recorded as doing anything in Sidon itself. At other times when Jesus went to places he would not normally have been expected to go, the Word of God shows the profit of his journey. For example, when Jesus Christ went to Samaria in event #32 (John 4:1-42), the Samaritans believed. Thus from both textual and internal evidence, the Scripture points to Jesus' travel to the northern part of Galilee and then southward again.

This record differs from the previous record in event #82 (Matthew 14:13-21; Mark 6:32-44; Luke 9:10b-17; and John 6:1-15) where he fed about 5,000 men plus women and children with five loaves and two fish. See event #82.

## 92. CROSSING TO THE WEST COAST OF SEA OF GALILEE; CONFRONTATIONS AND TEACHING.

After sending the multitude away, Jesus and his disciples cross the sea by boat again and come to the region of "Magadan," or "Magdala" (according to Matthew), on the west coast of the sea. In the King James Version, Mark calls this area "Dalmanutha," but in various manuscripts Mark gives each of these three names for this place. Nothing is known of any of these names except Magdala which was a city on the west coast of the Sea of Galilee, north of Tiberias, where Mary Magdalene came from. Here, Jesus again confronts the Pharisees and Sadducees who ask a sign of him. This is not the first time he discusses signs (see Matthew 12:38-39-event #64; and John 6:30—event #86), nor is it the last time (Luke 11:16-29-event #112). These events are different incidents, although similar to each other.

# V. The Month of Tishri and the Royal High Priest (September 20 – October 19, 27 A.D.)

94. MANY DISCIPLES LEAVE JESUS; TRANSITIONAL AND SUMMARY STATEMENT. This verse gives the response to Jesus' challenge during the time from his Capernaum teaching in event #86 (John 6:59) to the time he was with his disciples around Caesarea Philippi. Thus, John 6:66 really is a summary of events #87 through #93.

96. THE TRANSFIGURATION; OFFICIAL OPENING OF JESUS' MINISTRY AS HIGH PRIEST—seven days later; Tishri 10 (September 29), 27 A.D. The transfiguration occurs "after six days" (Matthew 17: 1) and "about an eight days after these sayings" (Luke 9: 28) that Jesus Christ had spoken while he was near Caesarea Philippi. Jesus takes Peter, James, and John "apart" to a high mountain. ("Apart" refers to the apostles rather than the high mountain.) The notable mountain in the vicinity of Caesarea Philippi is Mount Hermon, the most beautiful and conspicuous mountain in all Israel and Syria. It has peaks over 9,000 feet, which is high compared to most peaks in Palestine which are between 2,000 and 3,000 feet. The transfiguration happened on Mount Hermon. At this time the second announcement from heaven occurs. See events #21 and #127 for the other two announcements.

100. TRAVEL THROUGH GALILEE; SPEAKS OF HIS SUFFERING. After healing the child who had an unclean spirit, Jesus Christ leaves the area of Caesarea Philippi with his disciples and heads south. According to Matthew 17: 22, they "abode in Galilee." However, according to Mark 9:30 they "passed through Galilee." The word "abode" in Matthew is <u>sustrephomenon</u> in many Greek manuscripts, which means "as they were gathering" or "as they were coming together." The Aramaic uses a form of <u>hphak</u>, which means "as they were occupied," rather than the normal word for "abide," which is <u>qwa</u>. Here, Jesus

Christ and his disciples pass through Galilee. Sometime during this period Jesus gathers his disciples and speaks about his suffering.

102. JOURNEY TO JERUSALEM VIA SAMARIA--Tishri 13 and 14 (October 2 and 3), 27 A.D. The Gospel of Luke records Jesus going to Jerusalem through Samaria. The reason for the trip to Jerusalem is the Feast of Tabernacles, as is recorded in John 7:2 (event #101). Jesus Christ goes secretly to the Feast of Tabernacles (John 7: 10). In order to remain undiscovered, Jesus travels through Samaria and does not take the usual roads through Perea. As a result, his trip is shorter than usual.

103. IN JERUSALEM AT THE FEAST OF TABERNACLES--Tishri 15-22 (October 4-11), 27 A.D. The events in John 7:11--10:21 occur during the Feast of Tabernacles.

# JOHN 7:11-36

7:11 Then the Jews sought him at the feast, and said, Where is he? <sup>12</sup> And there was much murmuring among the people concerning him: for some said, He is a good man: others said, Nay; but he deceiveth the people. 13 Howbeit no man spake openly of him for fear of the Jews. <sup>14</sup> Now about the midst of the feast Jesus went up into the temple, and taught. <sup>15</sup> And the Jews marvelled, saying, How knoweth this man letters, having never learned? <sup>16</sup> Jesus answered them, and said, My doctrine is not mine, but his that sent me. <sup>17</sup> If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself. <sup>18</sup> He that speaketh of himself seeketh his own glory: but he that seeketh his glory that sent him, the same is true, and no unrighteousness is in him. 19 Did not Moses give you the law, and yet none of you keepeth the law? 104. John 7:53-8:11, the record of the woman caught in adultery, chronologically could not have occurred at the point it appears in the King James Version. If it had, it would add a full day to the Biblical record (John 8:1-2). This would make the healing of the man born blind recorded in John 9 occur on the weekly Sabbath after the Feast of Tabernacles (according to John 9:14). However, in 27 A.D. the day after Tabernacles was a Sunday, not the weekly Sabbath. Some manuscripts omit the section of scripture between John 7:53--8: 11. No Greek Church Father earlier than the twelfth century comments on it. In manuscripts which do contain it, it is placed at various locations. Some place it after John 7:36 or after John 7:44 or after John 21:25 or after Luke 21:38 or after Luke 24:53.

(JOHN 7:53-8:11)

7:53 And every man went unto his own house.

8:1 Jesus went unto the mount of Olives. <sup>2</sup> And early in the morning he came again into the temple, and all the people came unto him; and he sat down, and taught them. <sup>3</sup> And the scribes and Pharisees brought unto him a woman taken in adultery; and when they had set her in the midst, <sup>4</sup> They say unto him, Master, this woman was taken in adultery, in the very act. <sup>5</sup> Now Moses in the law commanded us, that such should be stoned: but what sayest thou? <sup>6</sup> This they said, tempting him, that they might have to accuse him. And Jesus said unto her, Neither do I condemn thee: go, and sin no more.

105. Things return to their proper order on describing the last day of the feast or another special Sabbath. The healing described in event #106 occurred on this same day.

But some said, Shall Christ come out of Galilee? 42 Hath not the scripture said, That Christ cometh of the seed of David, and out of the town of Bethlehem, where David was? <sup>43</sup> So there was a division among the people because of him. 44 And some of them would have taken him; but no man laid hands on him. 45 Then came the officers to the chief priests and Pharisees; and they said unto them, Why have ye not brought him? 46 The officers answered, Never man spake like this man. 47 Then answered them the Pharisees, Are ye also deceived? 48 Have any of the rulers or of the Pharisees believed on him? <sup>49</sup> But this people who knoweth not the law are cursed. 50 Nicodemus saith unto them, (he that came to Jesus by night, being one of them,) <sup>51</sup> Doth our law judge any man, before it hear him, and know what he doeth? 52 They answered and said unto him, Art thou also of Galilee? Search, and look: for out of Galilee ariseth no prophet.

106. Without the addition of the day in John 8:2 (related to the adulterous woman, dealt with in event #104), the Sabbath on which the man born blind is healed (John 9:14) is both the holy convocation, that is a special Sabbath, the eighth day of the Feast of Tabernacles (compare Leviticus 23:36-39 and Numbers 29:35), and a weekly Sabbath (Tishri 22 was on Saturday in 27 A.D.). John 7:53--8:11 stands best after John 7:36 in the text, prior to the last days of the feast.

Then said they to him, We be not born of fornication; we have one Father, even God. 42 Jesus said unto them, If God were your Father, ye would love me: for I proceeded forth and came from God; neither came I of myself, but he sent me. 43 Why do ye not understand my speech? even because ye cannot hear my word. 44 Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it. 45 And because I tell you the truth, ye believe me not. 46 Which of you convinceth me of sin? And if I say the truth, why do ye not believe me? 47 He that is of God heareth God's words: ye therefore hear them not, because ye are not of God. 48 Then answered the Jews, and said unto him, Say we not well that thou art a Samaritan, and hast a devil? 49 Jesus answered, I have not a devil; but I honour my Father, and ye do dishonour me. <sup>50</sup> And I seek not mine own glory: there is one that seeketh and judgeth. 51 Verily, verily, I say unto you, If a man keep my saying, he shall never see death. 52 Then said the Jews unto him, Now we know that thou hast a devil. Abraham is dead, and the prophets; and thou sayest, If a man keep my saying, he shall never taste of death. 53 Art thou greater than our father Abraham, which is dead? and the prophets are dead: whom makest thou thyself? 54 Jesus answered, If I honour myself, my honour is nothing: it is my Father that honoureth me; of whom ye say, that he is your God: 55 Yet ye have not known him; but I know him: and if I should say, I know him not, I shall be a liar like unto you: but I know him, and keep his saying. <sup>56</sup> Your father Abraham rejoiced to see my day: and he saw it, and was glad. 57 Then said the Jews unto him, Thou art not yet fifty years old, and hast thou seen Abraham? 58 Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Before Abraham was, I am. 59 Then took they up stones to cast at him: but Jesus hid himself, and went out of the temple, going through the midst of them, and so passed by.

# JOHN 9:1-41

9:1 And as Jesus passed by, he saw a man which was blind from his birth. 2 And his disciples asked him, saying, Master, who did sin, this man, or his parents, that he was born blind? <sup>3</sup> Jesus answered, Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that the works of God should be made manifest in him. 4 I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work. <sup>5</sup> As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world. 6 When he had thus spoken, he spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and he anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay, <sup>7</sup> And said unto him, Go, wash in the pool of Siloam, (which is by interpretation, Sent.) He went his way therefore, and washed, and came seeing. 8 The neighbours therefore, and they which before had seen him that he was blind, said, Is not this he that sat and begged? 9 Some said, This is he: others said, He is like him: but he said, I am he. 10 Therefore said they unto him, How were thine eyes opened? 11 He answered and said, A man that is called Jesus made clay, and anointed mine eyes, and said unto me, Go to the pool of Siloam, and wash: and I went and washed, and I received sight. <sup>12</sup> Then said they unto him, Where is he? He said, I know not. <sup>13</sup> They brought to the Pharisees him that aforetime was blind. <sup>14</sup> And it was the sabbath day when Jesus made the clay, and opened his eyes. <sup>15</sup> Then again the Pharisees also asked him how he had received his sight. He said unto them, He put clay upon mine eyes, and I washed, and do see. 16 Therefore said some of the Pharisees, This man is not of God, because he keepeth not the sabbath day. Others said, How can a man that is a sinner do such miracles? And there was a division among them. <sup>17</sup> They say unto the blind man again, What sayest thou of him, that he hath opened thine eyes? He said, He is a prophet. 18 But the Jews did not believe concerning him, that he had been blind, and received his sight, until they called the parents of him that had received his sight. 19 And they asked them, saying, Is this your son, who ye say was born blind? how then doth he now see? 20 His parents answered them and said, We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind: <sup>21</sup> But by what means he now seeth, we know not; or who hath opened his eyes, we know not: he is of age; ask him: he shall speak for himself. 22 These words spake his parents, because they feared the Jews: for the Jews had agreed already, that if any man did confess that he was Christ, he should be put out of the synagogue. <sup>23</sup> Therefore said his parents, He is of age; ask him. <sup>24</sup> Then again called they the man that was blind, and said unto him, Give God the praise: we know that this man is a sinner. <sup>25</sup> He answered and said, Whether

he be a sinner or no, I know not: one thing I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I see. <sup>26</sup> Then said they to him again, What did he to thee? how opened he thine eyes? <sup>27</sup> He answered them, I have told you already, and ye did not hear: wherefore would ye hear it again? will ye also be his disciples? 28 Then they reviled him, and said, Thou art his disciple; but we are Moses' disciples. <sup>29</sup> We know that God spake unto Moses: as for this fellow, we know not from whence he is. 30 The man answered and said unto them, Why herein is a marvellous thing, that ye know not from whence he is, and yet he hath opened mine eyes. <sup>31</sup> Now we know that God heareth not sinners: but if any man be a worshipper of God, and doeth his will, him he heareth. <sup>32</sup> Since the world began was it not heard that any man opened the eyes of one that was born blind. 33 If this man were not of God, he could do nothing. 34 They answered and said unto him, Thou wast altogether born in sins, and dost thou teach us? And they cast him out. 35 Jesus heard that they had cast him out; and when he had found him, he said unto him, Dost thou believe on the Son of God? <sup>36</sup> He answered and said, Who is he, Lord, that I might believe on him? <sup>37</sup> And Jesus said unto him, Thou hast both seen him, and it is he that talketh with thee. 38 And he said, Lord, I believe. And he worshipped him. <sup>39</sup> And Jesus said, For judgment I am come into this world, that they which see not might see; and that they which see might be made blind. 40 And some of the Pharisees which were with him heard these words, and said unto him, Are we blind also? <sup>41</sup> Jesus said unto them, If ye were blind, ye should have no sin: but now ye say, We see; therefore your sin remaineth.

#### 106c. The Good Shepherd.

# JOHN 10:1-21

10:1 Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that entereth not by the door into the sheepfold, but climbeth up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber. <sup>2</sup> But he that entereth in by the door is the shepherd of the sheep. <sup>3</sup> To him the porter openeth; and the sheep hear his voice: and he calleth his own sheep by name, and leadeth them out. <sup>4</sup> And when he putteth forth his own sheep, he goeth before them, and the sheep follow him: for they know his voice. <sup>5</sup> And a stranger will they not follow, but will flee from him: for they know not the voice of strangers. <sup>6</sup> This parable spake Jesus unto them: but they understood not what things they were which he spake unto them. <sup>7</sup> Then said Jesus unto them again, Verily, verily, I say unto you, I am the door of the sheep. <sup>8</sup> All that ever came before me are thieves and robbers: but the sheep did not hear them. <sup>9</sup> I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture. <sup>10</sup> The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have *it* more abundantly. <sup>11</sup> I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep. <sup>12</sup> But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd, whose own

the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, and scattereth the sheep. <sup>13</sup> The hireling fleeth, because he is an hireling, and careth not for the sheep. <sup>14</sup> I am the good shepherd, and know my *sheep*, and am known of mine. <sup>15</sup> As the Father knoweth me, even so know I the Father: and I lay down my life for the sheep. <sup>16</sup> And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, *and* one shepherd. <sup>17</sup> Therefore doth my Father love me, because I lay down my life, that I might take it again. <sup>18</sup> No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This commandment have I received of my Father. <sup>19</sup> There was a division therefore again among the Jews for these sayings. <sup>20</sup> And many of them said, He hath a devil, and is mad; why hear ye him? <sup>21</sup> Others said, These are not the words of him that hath a devil. Can a devil open the eyes of the blind?

107. SENDING FORTH OF THE SEVENTY INTO GALILEE; JESUS VISITS THEM. There are nine weeks between the end of the Feast of Tabernacles--Tishri 22 (October 11), 27 A.D.--and the beginning of the Feast of Dedication--Kislev 25 (December 13), 27 A.D. During this time Jesus sends out the seventy and makes an itinerary to the cities where they are sent.

# LUKE 10:1-24

10:1 After these things the Lord appointed other seventy also, and sent them two and two before his face into every city and place, whither he himself would come. <sup>2</sup> Therefore said he unto them, The harvest truly is great, but the labourers are few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers into his harvest. <sup>3</sup> Go your ways: behold, I send you forth as lambs among wolves. 4 Carry neither purse, nor scrip, nor shoes: and salute no man by the way. <sup>5</sup> And into whatsoever house ye enter, first say, Peace be to this house. 6 And if the son of peace be there, your peace shall rest upon it: if not, it shall turn to you again. <sup>7</sup> And in the same house remain, eating and drinking such things as they give: for the labourer is worthy of his hire. Go not from house to house. 8 And into whatsoever city ye enter, and they receive you, eat such things as are set before you: 9 And heal the sick that are therein, and say unto them, The kingdom of God is come nigh unto you. <sup>10</sup> But into whatsoever city ye enter, and they receive you not, go your ways out into the streets of the same, and say, <sup>11</sup> Even the very dust of your city, which cleaveth on us, we do wipe off against you: notwithstanding be ye sure of this, that the kingdom of God is come nigh unto you. 12 But I say unto you, that it shall be more tolerable in that day for Sodom, than for that city. <sup>13</sup> Woe unto thee, Chorazin! woe unto thee, Bethsaida! for if the mighty works had been done in Tyre and Sidon, which have been done in you, they had a great while ago repented, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. <sup>14</sup> But it shall be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgment, than for you. 15 And thou, Capernaum, which art exalted to heaven, shalt be thrust down to hell. <sup>16</sup> He that heareth you heareth me; and he that despiseth you despiseth me; and he that despiseth me despiseth him that sent me. <sup>17</sup> And the seventy returned again with joy, saying, Lord, even the devils are subject unto us through thy name. <sup>18</sup> And he said unto them, I beheld Satan as lightning fall from heaven. <sup>19</sup> Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you. <sup>20</sup> Notwithstanding in this rejoice not, that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven. <sup>21</sup> In that hour Jesus rejoiced in spirit, and said, I thank thee, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that thou hast hid these things from the wise and prudent, and hast revealed them unto babes: even so, Father; for so it seemed good in thy sight. <sup>22</sup> All things are delivered to me of my Father: and no man knoweth who the Son is, but the Father; and

who the Father is, but the Son, and *he* to whom the Son will reveal *him*. <sup>23</sup> And he turned him unto *his* disciples, and said privately, Blessed *are* the eyes which see the things that ye see: <sup>24</sup> For I tell you, that many prophets and kings have desired to see those things which ye see, and have not seen *them*; and to hear those things which ye hear, and have not heard *them*.

108. QUESTIONING OF LAWYER; PARABLE OF THE GOOD SAMARITAN. This event is similar but not identical to the incident of the questioning scribe in Matthew 22:34-40 and Mark 12:28-34 (event #131). Here, in response to the lawyer's tempting him, Jesus asks the question and the lawyer answers with the commandment from Deuteronomy 6:5. In event #131 the scribe asks the question and Jesus answers with the commandment from Deuteronomy 6:4 and 5. Also, event #131 happens later, just prior to Jesus' crucifixion.

# LUKE 10:25-37

10:25 And, behold, a certain lawyer stood up, and tempted him, saying, Master, what shall I do to inherit eternal life? <sup>26</sup> He said unto him, What is written in the law? how readest thou? <sup>27</sup> And he answering said, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbour as thyself. <sup>28</sup> And he said unto him, Thou hast answered right: this do, and thou shalt live. <sup>29</sup> But he, willing to justify himself, said unto Jesus, And who is my neighbour? <sup>30</sup> And Jesus answering said, A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among thieves, which stripped him of his raiment, and wounded him, and departed, leaving him half dead. <sup>31</sup> And by chance there came down a certain priest that way: and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. <sup>32</sup> And likewise a Levite, when he was at the place, came and looked on him, and passed by on the other side. 33 But a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was: and when he saw him, he had compassion on him, <sup>34</sup> And went to him, and bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine, and set him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn, and took care of him. <sup>35</sup> And on the morrow when he departed, he took out two pence, and gave them to the host, and said unto him, Take care of him; and whatsoever thou spendest more, when I come again, I will repay thee. <sup>36</sup> Which now of these three, thinkest thou, was neighbour unto him that fell among the thieves? <sup>37</sup> And he said, He that shewed mercy on him. Then said Jesus unto him, Go, and do thou likewise.

# VI. The Winter and Spring of 27 and 28 A.D. (December 13, 27 A.D. – April 22, 28 A.D.)

109. SUPPER AT BETHANY. The "certain village" in this event is Bethany because Mary and Martha were the sisters of Lazarus, who lived in Bethany, as recorded in John 11:1 (event #115). The supper occurs as Jesus and his disciples travel to the Feast of Dedication. Bethany lies less than two miles to the east of Jerusalem, on the eastern slope of the Mount of Olives.

#### LUKE 10:38-42

10:38 Now it came to pass, as they went, that he entered into a certain village: and a certain woman named Martha received him into her house. <sup>39</sup> And she had a sister called Mary, which also sat at Jesus' feet, and heard his word. <sup>40</sup> But Martha was cumbered about much serving, and came to him, and said, Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? bid her therefore that she help me. <sup>41</sup> And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things: <sup>42</sup> But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her.

110. ATTENDANCE AT THE FEAST OF DEDICATION IN JERUSALEM--Kislev 25--Tebeth 2 (December 13-20), 27 A.D. Nine weeks after the Feast of Tabernacles (events #103-106).

# JOHN 10:22-39

10:22 And it was at Jerusalem the feast of the dedication, and it was winter. <sup>23</sup> And Jesus walked in the temple in Solomon's porch. <sup>24</sup> Then came the Jews round about him, and said unto him, How long dost thou make us to doubt? If thou be the Christ, tell us plainly. <sup>25</sup> Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believed not: the works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me. 26 But ye believe not, because ye are not of my sheep, as I said unto you. <sup>27</sup> My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me: <sup>28</sup> And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand. <sup>29</sup> My Father, which gave *them* me, is greater than all; and no *man* is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand. <sup>30</sup> I and my Father are one. <sup>31</sup> Then the Jews took up stones again to stone him. <sup>32</sup> Jesus answered them, Many good works have I shewed you from my Father; for which of those works do ye stone me? <sup>33</sup> The Jews answered him, saying, For a good work we stone thee not; but for blasphemy; and because that thou, being a man, makest thyself God. <sup>34</sup> Jesus answered them, Is it not written in your law, I said, Ye are gods? 35 If he called them gods, unto whom the word of God came, and the scripture cannot be broken; <sup>36</sup> Say ye of him, whom the Father hath sanctified, and sent into the world, Thou blasphemest; because I said, I am the Son of God? <sup>37</sup> If I do not the works of my Father, believe me not. <sup>38</sup> But if I do, though ye believe not me, believe the works: that ye may know, and believe, that the Father is in me, and I in him. <sup>39</sup> Therefore they sought again to take him: but he escaped out of their hand

# 111. TRAVEL TO JORDAN AREA (PEREA). This area offered a warm climate during the winter months.

### JOHN 10:40-42

10:40 And went away again beyond Jordan into the place where John at first baptized; and there he abode. <sup>41</sup> And many resorted unto him, and said, John did no miracle: but all things that John spake of this man were true. <sup>42</sup> And many believed on him there.

112. TEACHING IN JORDAN AREA (PEREA) SHORTLY AFTER THE FEAST OF DEDICATION. Some of the teachings in this record are similar, but not identical, to the teaching on a mountain in Galilee (event #41) and Jesus' Galilean teachings (event #64), as well as other teachings. Likewise, the healing of the dumb man in Luke 11: 14 is not identical to the healing of the man who was both blind and dumb in Matthew 12:22 (event #64). Similar events and situations often elicited similar teachings.

Next, the subdivisions envisioned by Walter J. Cummins have been included \*:

# 112a. Teaching about Prayer in a Certain Place.

# LUKE 11:1-13

11:1 And it came to pass, that, as he was praying in a certain place, when he ceased, one of his disciples said unto him, Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples. <sup>2</sup> And he said unto them, When ye pray, say, Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, as in heaven, so in earth. <sup>3</sup> Give us day by day our daily bread. <sup>4</sup> And forgive us our sins; for we also forgive every one that is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. 5 And he said unto them, Which of you shall have a friend, and shall go unto him at midnight, and say unto him, Friend, lend me three loaves; <sup>6</sup> For a friend of mine in his journey is come to me, and I have nothing to set before him? 7 And he from within shall answer and say, Trouble me not: the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot rise and give thee. <sup>8</sup> I say unto you, Though he will not rise and give him, because he is his friend, yet because of his importunity he will rise and give him as many as he needeth. <sup>9</sup> And I say unto you, Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. 10 For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened. 11 If a son shall ask bread of any of you that is a father, will he give him a stone? or if he ask a fish, will he for a fish give him a serpent? 12 Or if he shall ask an egg, will he offer him a scorpion? 13 If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children: how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him?

#### 112b. Casting out a Devil Spirit and Teaching the People.

# LUKE 11:14-36

11:14 And he was casting out a devil, and it was dumb. And it came to pass, when the devil was gone out, the dumb spake; and the people wondered. <sup>15</sup> But some of them said, He casteth out devils through Beelzebub the chief of the devils. <sup>16</sup> And others, tempting *him*, sought of him a sign from heaven. <sup>17</sup> But he, knowing their thoughts, said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and a house *divided* against a house falleth. <sup>18</sup> If Satan also be divided against himself, how shall his kingdom stand? because ye say that I cast out devils through Beelzebub. <sup>19</sup> And if I by Beelzebub cast out devils, by

whom do your sons cast them out? therefore shall they be your judges. <sup>20</sup> But if I with the finger of God cast out devils, no doubt the kingdom of God is come upon you. <sup>21</sup> When a strong man armed keepeth his palace, his goods are in peace: <sup>22</sup> But when a stronger than he shall come upon him, and overcome him, he taketh from him all his armour wherein he trusted, and divideth his spoils. 23 He that is not with me is against me: and he that gathereth not with me scattereth. <sup>24</sup> When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest; and finding none, he saith, I will return unto my house whence I came out. <sup>25</sup> And when he cometh, he findeth it swept and garnished. <sup>26</sup> Then goeth he, and taketh to him seven other spirits more wicked than himself; and they enter in, and dwell there: and the last *state* of that man is worse than the first. <sup>27</sup> And it came to pass, as he spake these things, a certain woman of the company lifted up her voice, and said unto him, Blessed is the womb that bare thee, and the paps which thou hast sucked. <sup>28</sup> But he said, Yea rather, blessed *are* they that hear the word of God, and keep it. <sup>29</sup> And when the people were gathered thick together, he began to say, This is an evil generation: they seek a sign; and there shall no sign be given it, but the sign of Jonas the prophet. 30 For as Jonas was a sign unto the Ninevites, so shall also the Son of man be to this generation. <sup>31</sup> The queen of the south shall rise up in the judgment with the men of this generation, and condemn them: for she came from the utmost parts of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon; and, behold, a greater than Solomon is here. 32 The men of Nineve shall rise up in the judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it: for they repented at the preaching of Jonas; and, behold, a greater than Jonas is here. 33 No man, when he hath lighted a candle, putteth it in a secret place, neither under a bushel, but on a candlestick, that they which come in may see the light. <sup>34</sup> The light of the body is the eye: therefore when thine eye is single, thy whole body also is full of light; but when thine eye is evil, thy body also is full of darkness. 35 Take heed therefore that the light which is in thee be not darkness. <sup>36</sup> If thy whole body therefore be full of light, having no part dark, the whole shall be full of light, as when the bright shining of a candle doth give thee light.

#### 112c. Another Meal with a Pharisee.

# LUKE 11:37-54

11:37 And as he spake, a certain Pharisee besought him to dine with him: and he went in, and sat down to meat. <sup>38</sup> And when the Pharisee saw *it*, he marvelled that he had not first

washed before dinner. <sup>39</sup> And the Lord said unto him, Now do ye Pharisees make clean the outside of the cup and the platter; but your inward part is full of ravening and wickedness. <sup>40</sup> Ye fools, did not he that made that which is without make that which is within also? <sup>41</sup> But rather give alms of such things as ye have; and, behold, all things are clean unto you. 42 But woe unto you, Pharisees! for ye tithe mint and rue and all manner of herbs, and pass over judgment and the love of God: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone. 43 Woe unto you, Pharisees! for ye love the uppermost seats in the synagogues, and greetings in the markets. 44 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye are as graves which appear not, and the men that walk over them are not aware of them. 45 Then answered one of the lawyers, and said unto him, Master, thus saying thou reproachest us also. 46 And he said, Woe unto you also, ye lawyers! for ye lade men with burdens grievous to be borne, and ye yourselves touch not the burdens with one of your fingers. <sup>47</sup> Woe unto you! for ye build the sepulchres of the prophets, and your fathers killed them. <sup>48</sup> Truly ye bear witness that ye allow the deeds of your fathers: for they indeed killed them, and ye build their sepulchres. 49 Therefore also said the wisdom of God, I will send them prophets and apostles, and some of them they shall slay and persecute: 50 That the blood of all the prophets, which was shed from the foundation of the world, may be required of this generation; <sup>51</sup> From the blood of Abel unto the blood of Zacharias, which perished between the altar and the temple: verily I say unto you, It shall be required of this generation. <sup>52</sup> Woe unto you, lawyers! for ye have taken away the key of knowledge: ye entered not in yourselves, and them that were entering in ye hindered. 53 And as he said these things unto them, the scribes and the Pharisees began to urge him vehemently, and to provoke him to speak of many things: 54 Laying wait for him, and seeking to catch something out of his mouth, that they might accuse him.

#### 112d. Teaching to the Disciples and to a Multitude.

#### LUKE 12:1-13:9

12:1 In the mean time, when there were gathered together an innumerable multitude of people, insomuch that they trode one upon another, he began to say unto his disciples first of all, Beware ye of the leaven of the Pharisees, which is hypocrisy. <sup>2</sup> For there is nothing covered, that shall not be revealed; neither hid, that shall not be known. <sup>3</sup> Therefore whatsoever ye have spoken in darkness shall be heard in the light; and that which ye have

spoken in the ear in closets shall be proclaimed upon the housetops. <sup>4</sup> And I say unto you my friends, Be not afraid of them that kill the body, and after that have no more that they can do. <sup>5</sup> But I will forewarn you whom ye shall fear: Fear him, which after he hath killed hath power to cast into hell; yea, I say unto you, Fear him. <sup>6</sup> Are not five sparrows sold for two farthings, and not one of them is forgotten before God? 7 But even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not therefore: ye are of more value than many sparrows. 8 Also I say unto you, Whosoever shall confess me before men, him shall the Son of man also confess before the angels of God: 9 But he that denieth me before men shall be denied before the angels of God. 10 And whosoever shall speak a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but unto him that blasphemeth against the Holy Ghost it shall not be forgiven. 11 And when they bring you unto the synagogues, and unto magistrates, and powers, take ye no thought how or what thing ye shall answer, or what ye shall say: 12 For the Holy Ghost shall teach you in the same hour what ye ought to say. 13 And one of the company said unto him, Master, speak to my brother, that he divide the inheritance with me. 14 And he said unto him, Man, who made me a judge or a divider over you? 15 And he said unto them, Take heed, and beware of covetousness: for a man's life consisteth not in the abundance of the things which he possesseth. <sup>16</sup> And he spake a parable unto them, saying, The ground of a certain rich man brought forth plentifully: 17 And he thought within himself, saying, What shall I do, because I have no room where to bestow my fruits? <sup>18</sup> And he said, This will I do: I will pull down my barns, and build greater; and there will I bestow all my fruits and my goods. 19 And I will say to my soul, Soul, thou hast much goods laid up for many years; take thine ease, eat, drink, and be merry. 20 But God said unto him, Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those things be, which thou hast provided? <sup>21</sup> So is he that layeth up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God. <sup>22</sup> And he said unto his disciples, Therefore I say unto you, Take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat; neither for the body, what ye shall put on. <sup>23</sup> The life is more than meat, and the body is more than raiment. <sup>24</sup> Consider the ravens: for they neither sow nor reap; which neither have storehouse nor barn; and God feedeth them: how much more are ye better than the fowls? <sup>25</sup> And which of you with taking thought can add to his stature one cubit? <sup>26</sup> If ye then be not able to do that thing which is least, why take ye thought for the rest? <sup>27</sup> Consider the lilies how they grow: they toil not, they spin not; and yet I say unto you, that Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. <sup>28</sup> If

then God so clothe the grass, which is to day in the field, and to morrow is cast into the oven; how much more will he clothe you, O ye of little faith? 29 And seek not ye what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink, neither be ye of doubtful mind. <sup>30</sup> For all these things do the nations of the world seek after: and your Father knoweth that ye have need of these things. 31 But rather seek ye the kingdom of God; and all these things shall be added unto you. <sup>32</sup> Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. <sup>33</sup> Sell that ye have, and give alms; provide yourselves bags which wax not old, a treasure in the heavens that faileth not, where no thief approacheth, neither moth corrupteth. <sup>34</sup> For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also. <sup>35</sup> Let your loins be girded about, and your lights burning; 36 And ye yourselves like unto men that wait for their lord, when he will return from the wedding; that when he cometh and knocketh, they may open unto him immediately. 37 Blessed are those servants, whom the lord when he cometh shall find watching: verily I say unto you, that he shall gird himself, and make them to sit down to meat, and will come forth and serve them. <sup>38</sup> And if he shall come in the second watch, or come in the third watch, and find them so, blessed are those servants. <sup>39</sup> And this know, that if the goodman of the house had known what hour the thief would come, he would have watched, and not have suffered his house to be broken through. 40 Be ye therefore ready also: for the Son of man cometh at an hour when ye think not. 41 Then Peter said unto him, Lord, speakest thou this parable unto us, or even to all? 42 And the Lord said, Who then is that faithful and wise steward, whom his lord shall make ruler over his household, to give them their portion of meat in due season? 43 Blessed is that servant, whom his lord when he cometh shall find so doing. 44 Of a truth I say unto you, that he will make him ruler over all that he hath. 45 But and if that servant say in his heart, My lord delayeth his coming; and shall begin to beat the menservants and maidens, and to eat and drink, and to be drunken; 46 The lord of that servant will come in a day when he looketh not for him, and at an hour when he is not aware, and will cut him in sunder, and will appoint him his portion with the unbelievers. 47 And that servant, which knew his lord's will, and prepared not himself, neither did according to his will, shall be beaten with many stripes. 48 But he that knew not, and did commit things worthy of stripes, shall be beaten with few stripes. For unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required: and to whom men have committed much, of him they will ask the more. 49 I am come to send fire on the earth; and what will I if it be already kindled? <sup>50</sup> But I have a baptism to be baptized with; and how am I straitened till it be accomplished! <sup>51</sup> Suppose ye that I am come to give peace on earth? I tell you, Nay; but rather division: <sup>52</sup> For from henceforth there shall be five in one house divided, three against two, and two against three. <sup>53</sup> The father shall be divided against the son, and the son against the father; the mother against the daughter, and the daughter against the mother; the mother in law against her daughter in law, and the daughter in law against her mother in law. <sup>54</sup> And he said also to the people, When ye see a cloud rise out of the west, straightway ye say, There cometh a shower; and so it is. <sup>55</sup> And when *ye see* the south wind blow, ye say, There will be heat; and it cometh to pass. <sup>56</sup> *Ye* hypocrites, ye can discern the face of the sky and of the earth; but how is it that ye do not discern this time? <sup>57</sup> Yea, and why even of yourselves judge ye not what is right? <sup>58</sup> When thou goest with thine adversary to the magistrate, *as thou art* in the way, give diligence that thou mayest be delivered from him; lest he hale thee to the judge, and the judge deliver thee to the officer, and the officer cast thee into prison. <sup>59</sup> I tell thee, thou shalt not depart thence, till thou hast paid the very last mite.

13:1 There were present at that season some that told him of the Galilaeans, whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. <sup>2</sup> And Jesus answering said unto them, Suppose ye that these Galilaeans were sinners above all the Galilaeans, because they suffered such things? <sup>3</sup> I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish. <sup>4</sup> Or those eighteen, upon whom the tower in Siloam fell, and slew them, think ye that they were sinners above all men that dwelt in Jerusalem? <sup>5</sup> I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish. <sup>6</sup> He spake also this parable; A certain *man* had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came and sought fruit thereon, and found none. <sup>7</sup> Then said he unto the dresser of his vineyard, Behold, these three years I come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find none: cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground? <sup>8</sup> And he answering said unto him, Lord, let it alone this year also, till I shall dig about it, and dung *it:* <sup>9</sup> And if it bear fruit, *well:* and if not, *then* after that thou shalt cut it down.

# 113. HEALING OF WOMAN WHO HAD A SPIRIT OF INFIRMITY FOR EIGHTEEN YEARS--on the Sabbath

# LUKE 13:10-17

13:10 And he was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. <sup>11</sup> And, behold, there was a woman which had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bowed together, and could in no wise lift up *herself*. <sup>12</sup> And when Jesus saw her, he called *her to him*, and said unto her, Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity. <sup>13</sup> And he laid *his* hands on her: and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God. <sup>14</sup> And the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because that Jesus had healed on the sabbath day, and said unto the people, There are six days in which men ought to work: in them therefore come and be healed, and not on the sabbath day. <sup>15</sup> The Lord then answered him, and said, *Thou* hypocrite, doth not each one of you on the sabbath loose his ox or *his* ass from the stall, and lead *him* away to watering? <sup>16</sup> And ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan hath bound, lo, these eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on

the sabbath day? <sup>17</sup> And when he had said these things, all his adversaries were ashamed: and all the people rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by him.

114. PARABLES. Jesus gives the parables of the mustard seed and unleavened bread that he previously taught in event #64, but here he teaches to a different group of people at a different time in a different location.

# LUKE 13:18-21

13:18 Then said he, Unto what is the kingdom of God like? and whereunto shall I resemble it? <sup>19</sup> It is like a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and cast into his garden; and it grew, and waxed a great tree; and the fowls of the air lodged in the branches of it. <sup>20</sup> And again he said, Whereunto shall I liken the kingdom of God? <sup>21</sup> It is like leaven, which a woman took and hid in three measures of meal, till the whole was leavened.

#### 115. RAISING OF LAZARUS AT BETHANY

# JOHN 11:1-53

11:1 Now a certain man was sick, named Lazarus, of Bethany, the town of Mary and her sister Martha. <sup>2</sup> (It was that Mary which anointed the Lord with ointment, and wiped his feet with her hair, whose brother Lazarus was sick.) <sup>3</sup> Therefore his sisters sent unto him, saying, Lord, behold, he whom thou lovest is sick. 4 When Jesus heard that, he said, This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby. <sup>5</sup> Now Jesus loved Martha, and her sister, and Lazarus. <sup>6</sup> When he had heard therefore that he was sick, he abode two days still in the same place where he was. <sup>7</sup> Then after that saith he to his disciples, Let us go into Judaea again. 8 His disciples say unto him, Master, the Jews of late sought to stone thee; and goest thou thither again? <sup>9</sup> Jesus answered, Are there not twelve hours in the day? If any man walk in the day, he stumbleth not, because he seeth the light of this world. <sup>10</sup> But if a man walk in the night, he stumbleth, because there is no light in him. 11 These things said he: and after that he saith unto them, Our friend Lazarus sleepeth; but I go, that I may awake him out of sleep. 12 Then said his disciples, Lord, if he sleep, he shall do well. 13 Howbeit Jesus spake of his death: but they thought that he had spoken of taking of rest in sleep. <sup>14</sup> Then said Jesus unto them plainly, Lazarus is dead. <sup>15</sup> And I am glad for your sakes that I was not there, to the intent ye may believe; nevertheless let us go unto him. <sup>16</sup> Then said Thomas, which is called Didymus, unto his fellowdisciples, Let us also go, that we may die with him. <sup>17</sup> Then when Jesus came, he found that he had *lain* in the grave four days already. <sup>18</sup> Now Bethany was nigh unto Jerusalem, about fifteen furlongs off: 19 And many of the Jews came to Martha and Mary, to comfort them concerning their brother. <sup>20</sup> Then Martha, as soon as she heard that Jesus was coming, went and met him: but Mary sat *still* in the house. <sup>21</sup> Then said Martha unto Jesus, Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died. <sup>22</sup> But I know, that even now, whatsoever thou wilt ask of God, God will give it thee. <sup>23</sup> Jesus saith unto her, Thy brother shall rise again. <sup>24</sup> Martha saith unto him, I know that he shall rise again in the resurrection at the last day. <sup>25</sup> Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live: <sup>26</sup> And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this? <sup>27</sup> She saith unto him, Yea, Lord: I believe that thou art the Christ, the Son of God, which should come into the world. <sup>28</sup> And when she had so said, she went her way, and called Mary her sister secretly, saying, The Master is come, and calleth for thee. <sup>29</sup> As soon as she heard *that*, she arose quickly,

and came unto him. 30 Now Jesus was not yet come into the town, but was in that place where Martha met him. <sup>31</sup> The Jews then which were with her in the house, and comforted her, when they saw Mary, that she rose up hastily and went out, followed her, saving. She goeth unto the grave to weep there. <sup>32</sup> Then when Mary was come where Jesus was, and saw him, she fell down at his feet, saying unto him, Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died. 33 When Jesus therefore saw her weeping, and the Jews also weeping which came with her, he groaned in the spirit, and was troubled, 34 And said, Where have ye laid him? They said unto him, Lord, come and see. 35 Jesus wept. 36 Then said the Jews, Behold how he loved him! <sup>37</sup> And some of them said, Could not this man, which opened the eyes of the blind, have caused that even this man should not have died? <sup>38</sup> Jesus therefore again groaning in himself cometh to the grave. It was a cave, and a stone lay upon it. <sup>39</sup> Jesus said, Take ye away the stone. Martha, the sister of him that was dead, saith unto him, Lord, by this time he stinketh: for he hath been dead four days. 40 Jesus saith unto her, Said I not unto thee, that, if thou wouldest believe, thou shouldest see the glory of God? <sup>41</sup> Then they took away the stone from the place where the dead was laid. And Jesus lifted up his eyes, and said, Father, I thank thee that thou hast heard me. 42 And I knew that thou hearest me always: but because of the people which stand by I said it, that they may believe that thou hast sent me. 43 And when he thus had spoken, he cried with a loud voice, Lazarus, come forth. 44 And he that was dead came forth, bound hand and foot with graveclothes: and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus saith unto them, Loose him, and let him go. <sup>45</sup> Then many of the Jews which came to Mary, and had seen the things which Jesus did, believed on him. 46 But some of them went their ways to the Pharisees, and told them what things Jesus had done. <sup>47</sup> Then gathered the chief priests and the Pharisees a council, and said, What do we? for this man doeth many miracles. 48 If we let him thus alone, all men will believe on him: and the Romans shall come and take away both our place and nation. <sup>49</sup> And one of them, *named* Caiaphas, being the high priest that same year, said unto them, Ye know nothing at all, 50 Nor consider that it is expedient for us, that one man should die for the people, and that the whole nation perish not. <sup>51</sup> And this spake he not of himself: but being high priest that year, he prophesied that Jesus should die for that nation; <sup>52</sup> And not for that nation only, but that also he should gather together in one the children of God that were scattered abroad. 53 Then from that day forth they took counsel together for to put him to death.

#### 116. TRAVEL TO CITY OF EPHRAIM IN JUDEA

#### JOHN 11:54

11:54 Jesus therefore walked no more openly among the Jews; but went thence unto a country near to the wilderness, into a city called Ephraim, and there continued with his disciples.

117. LAST TEACHING ITINERARY BEFORE RETURN TO JERUSALEM. Jesus travels from Ephraim (event #116) through Samaria and Galilee, then over the Jordan, down through Perea (event #118), and then through Jericho (events #119-122) to Jerusalem (Luke 13:22; 17:11). Parts of these teachings are similar to some of his previous teachings in Galilee.

Next, the subdivisions envisioned by Walter J. Cummins have been included \*:

# LUKE 13:22-35

13:22 And he went through the cities and villages, teaching, and journeying toward Jerusalem. <sup>23</sup> Then said one unto him, Lord, are there few that be saved? And he said unto them, <sup>24</sup> Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able. <sup>25</sup> When once the master of the house is risen up, and hath shut to the door, and ye begin to stand without, and to knock at the door, saying, Lord, Lord, open unto us; and he shall answer and say unto you, I know you not whence ye are: <sup>26</sup> Then shall ye begin to say, We have eaten and drunk in thy presence, and thou hast taught in our streets. <sup>27</sup> But he shall say, I tell you, I know you not whence ye are; depart from me, all ye workers of iniquity. <sup>28</sup> There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when ye shall see Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, and all the prophets, in the kingdom of God, and you yourselves thrust out. <sup>29</sup> And they shall come from the east, and from the west, and from the north, and from the south, and shall sit down in the kingdom of God. 30 And, behold, there are last which shall be first, and there are first which shall be last. <sup>31</sup> The same day there came certain of the Pharisees, saying unto him, Get thee out, and depart hence: for Herod will kill thee. 32 And he said unto them, Go ye, and tell that fox, Behold, I cast out devils, and I do cures to day and to morrow, and the third day I shall be perfected. 33 Nevertheless I must walk to day, and to morrow, and the day following: for it cannot be that a prophet perish out of Jerusalem. <sup>34</sup> O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, which killest the prophets, and stonest them that are sent unto thee; how often would I have gathered thy children together, as a hen doth gather her brood under her wings, and ye would not! 35 Behold, your house is left unto you desolate: and verily I say unto you, Ye shall not see me, until the time come when ye shall say, Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.

#### 117b. Meal with a Chief Pharisee on a Sabbath.

# LUKE 14:1-24

14:1 And it came to pass, as he went into the house of one of the chief Pharisees to eat bread on the sabbath day, that they watched him. <sup>2</sup> And, behold, there was a certain man before him which had the dropsy. <sup>3</sup> And Jesus answering spake unto the lawyers and Pharisees, saying, Is it lawful to heal on the sabbath day? <sup>4</sup> And they held their peace. And he took *him*, and healed him, and let him go; <sup>5</sup> And answered them, saying, Which of you

shall have an ass or an ox fallen into a pit, and will not straightway pull him out on the sabbath day? <sup>6</sup> And they could not answer him again to these things. <sup>7</sup> And he put forth a parable to those which were bidden, when he marked how they chose out the chief rooms; saying unto them, <sup>8</sup> When thou art bidden of any man to a wedding, sit not down in the highest room; lest a more honourable man than thou be bidden of him; <sup>9</sup> And he that bade thee and him come and say to thee, Give this man place; and thou begin with shame to take the lowest room. 10 But when thou art bidden, go and sit down in the lowest room; that when he that bade thee cometh, he may say unto thee, Friend, go up higher: then shalt thou have worship in the presence of them that sit at meat with thee. 11 For whosoever exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted. 12 Then said he also to him that bade him, When thou makest a dinner or a supper, call not thy friends, nor thy brethren, neither thy kinsmen, nor thy rich neighbours; lest they also bid thee again, and a recompence be made thee. 13 But when thou makest a feast, call the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind: <sup>14</sup> And thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee: for thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just. <sup>15</sup> And when one of them that sat at meat with him heard these things, he said unto him, Blessed is he that shall eat bread in the kingdom of God. <sup>16</sup> Then said he unto him, A certain man made a great supper, and bade many: <sup>17</sup> And sent his servant at supper time to say to them that were bidden, Come; for all things are now ready. <sup>18</sup> And they all with one *consent* began to make excuse. The first said unto him, I have bought a piece of ground, and I must needs go and see it: I pray thee have me excused. <sup>19</sup> And another said, I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to prove them: I pray thee have me excused. 20 And another said, I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come. <sup>21</sup> So that servant came, and shewed his lord these things. Then the master of the house being angry said to his servant, Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in hither the poor, and the maimed, and the halt, and the blind. <sup>22</sup> And the servant said, Lord, it is done as thou hast commanded, and yet there is room. <sup>23</sup> And the lord said unto the servant, Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled. <sup>24</sup> For I say unto you, That none of those men which were bidden shall taste of my supper.

# LUKE 14:25-17:10

14:25 And there went great multitudes with him: and he turned, and said unto them, <sup>26</sup> If any *man* come to me, and hate not his father, and mother, and wife, and children, and brethren, and sisters, yea, and his own life also, he cannot be my disciple. <sup>27</sup> And whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me, cannot be my disciple. <sup>28</sup> For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first, and counteth the cost, whether he have *sufficient* to finish *it*? <sup>29</sup> Lest haply, after he hath laid the foundation, and is not able to finish *it*, all that behold *it* begin to mock him, <sup>30</sup> Saying, This man began to build, and was not able to finish. <sup>31</sup> Or what king, going to make war against another king, sitteth not down first, and consulteth whether he be able with ten thousand to meet him that cometh against him with twenty thousand? <sup>32</sup> Or else, while the other is yet a great way off, he sendeth an ambassage, and desireth conditions of peace. <sup>33</sup> So likewise, whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple. <sup>34</sup> Salt *is* good: but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be seasoned? <sup>35</sup> It is neither fit for the land, nor yet for the dunghill; *but* men cast it out. He that hath ears to hear, let him hear.

15:1 Then drew near unto him all the publicans and sinners for to hear him. <sup>2</sup> And the Pharisees and scribes murmured, saying, This man receiveth sinners, and eateth with them. <sup>3</sup> And he spake this parable unto them, saying, <sup>4</sup> What man of you, having an hundred sheep, if he lose one of them, doth not leave the ninety and nine in the wilderness, and go after that which is lost, until he find it? 5 And when he hath found it, he layeth it on his shoulders, rejoicing. <sup>6</sup> And when he cometh home, he calleth together his friends and neighbours, saying unto them, Rejoice with me; for I have found my sheep which was lost. <sup>7</sup> I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance. <sup>8</sup> Either what woman having ten pieces of silver, if she lose one piece, doth not light a candle, and sweep the house, and seek diligently till she find it? 9 And when she hath found it, she calleth her friends and her neighbours together, saying, Rejoice with me; for I have found the piece which I had lost. <sup>10</sup> Likewise, I say unto you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth. <sup>11</sup> And he said, A certain man had two sons: <sup>12</sup> And the younger of them said to his father, Father, give me the portion of goods that falleth to me. And he divided unto them his living. 13 And not many days after the younger son gathered all together, and took his journey into a far country, and there wasted his substance with

riotous living. 14 And when he had spent all, there arose a mighty famine in that land; and he began to be in want. <sup>15</sup> And he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country; and he sent him into his fields to feed swine. <sup>16</sup> And he would fain have filled his belly with the husks that the swine did eat: and no man gave unto him. <sup>17</sup> And when he came to himself, he said, How many hired servants of my father's have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger! <sup>18</sup> I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and before thee, <sup>19</sup> And am no more worthy to be called thy son: make me as one of thy hired servants. <sup>20</sup> And he arose, and came to his father. But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him. <sup>21</sup> And the son said unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son. 22 But the father said to his servants, Bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet: 23 And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill it; and let us eat, and be merry: 24 For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found. And they began to be merry. <sup>25</sup> Now his elder son was in the field: and as he came and drew night o the house, he heard musick and dancing. <sup>26</sup> And he called one of the servants, and asked what these things meant. <sup>27</sup> And he said unto him, Thy brother is come; and thy father hath killed the fatted calf, because he hath received him safe and sound. <sup>28</sup> And he was angry, and would not go in: therefore came his father out, and intreated him. <sup>29</sup> And he answering said to his father, Lo, these many years do I serve thee, neither transgressed I at any time thy commandment: and yet thou never gavest me a kid, that I might make merry with my friends: 30 But as soon as this thy son was come, which hath devoured thy living with harlots, thou hast killed for him the fatted calf. <sup>31</sup> And he said unto him, Son, thou art ever with me, and all that I have is thine. 32 It was meet that we should make merry, and be glad: for this thy brother was dead, and is alive again; and was lost, and is found.

The first time is recorded in event #101 (Matthew 18:1-5; Mark 9:33-37; Luke 9:46-48). A third dispute over the same issue arises at the last supper in event #141 (Luke 22:24-27).

120. JESUS AND ZACCHAEUS IN JERICHO. The details in the parable of the nobleman here differ from a similar parable given later in event #135 (Matthew 25:14-30).

122. HEALING OF TWO BLIND MEN ON WAYSIDE. Blindness was common in Palestine, therefore it is not surprising that a number of blind people were begging at different positions along the road outside the city gate. A major difference between events #121 and #122 is that in event #121 Jesus merely speaks to Bartimaeus while in this event he touches the eyes of the other two. Both of these records happen as Jesus leaves Jericho, whereas the healing of the blind man in event #119 is on Jesus' approach to Jericho.




### B. Near the Area of Galilee.


Numbers in **red** the locations of John the Baptist; he was imprisoned at Machaerus according to Josephus.
